

Overview:


Even though the March, 2023 statistic of 74 reported occurrences recorded a vast increase of 64% (or 29 reported occurrences) from the February, 2023 total, this statistic is proportional to the five year average of 72 reported occurrences for the month of March.

The category of Sexual Assault recorded an increase in the March, 2023 statistic from the February, 2023 datum, however two of the reported occurrences were historic in nature, along with two reported occurrences where the victim/suspect are known to each other.


The category of Theft also registered an increase in the March, 2023 statistic from the February, 2023 statistic and can mostly be attributed to a series of theft from mail occurrences along with reports of theft of catalytic converters and an oxygen sensor from parked vehicles.


The monthly total for the category of Homicide increased as a result of an occurrence where an adult male suspect discharged a firearm at a moving vehicle which had two occupants.

March 2023 Eight Crime Indicators Map




Occurrence Zones Break & Enter and Thefts – March 2023






March 2020, 2021, 2022 & 2023 Break & Enter and Thefts

"Mandatory Alcohol Screening" (MAS) Statistics



Crimes Against Property


5 Year Monthly Average – 78

Drug Occurrences


5 Year Monthly Average – 13








