The purpose of this report is to provide a standardized monthly analysis of crime trends within the City of Camrose. The report focuses on the eight primary crime indicators and presents statistical comparisons, trends, and contextual analysis to support operational decision-making, strategic planning, and community awareness.

Data Sources & Methodology:

Data contained in this report is derived from police Records Management Systems (RMS), Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD), and internal statistical tracking. Occurrence counts reflect reported incidents and may be subject to change as investigations continue or late reports are received.

Executive Summary:

In March 2026, the eight crime categories increased by 43% (15 additional reported occurrences) compared to February 2026; however, totals remained the same margin below the five-year average.

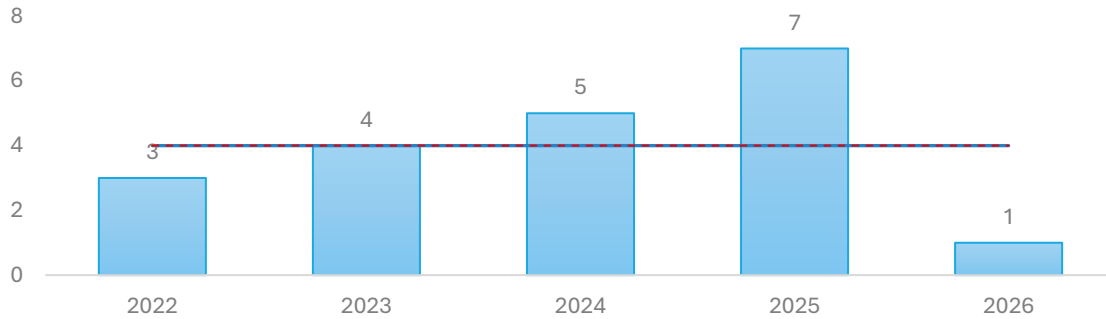
Crimes against persons nearly doubled compared to March 2025 and were 55% above the 5-year average. Increases were observed primarily in the categories of assault, criminal harassment and uttering threats.

A review of assault occurrences identified that eight incidents involved intimate partner or familial violence. Six occurrences involved repeat subjects, and two incidents included additional offences related to criminal harassment or uttering threats. Both assault police officer incidents occurred during the arrest of intoxicated individuals.

Crimes against property declined significantly from the elevated totals observed in March 2025, when multiple series involving thefts of catalytic converters, wire and welding cables, and thefts from motor vehicles were reported.

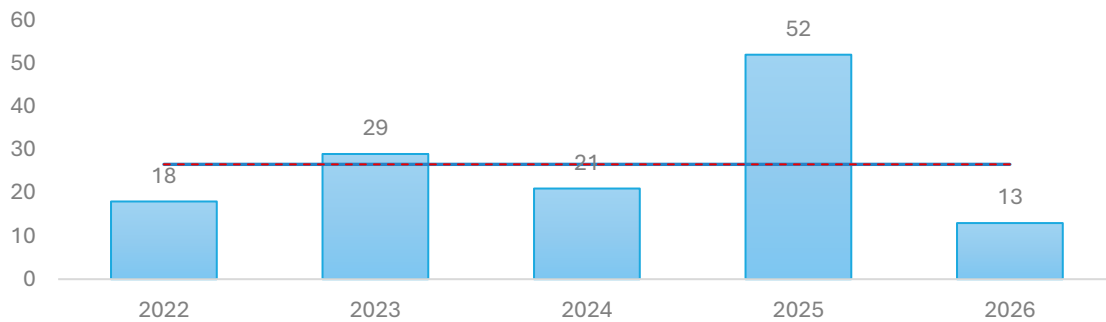

Theft

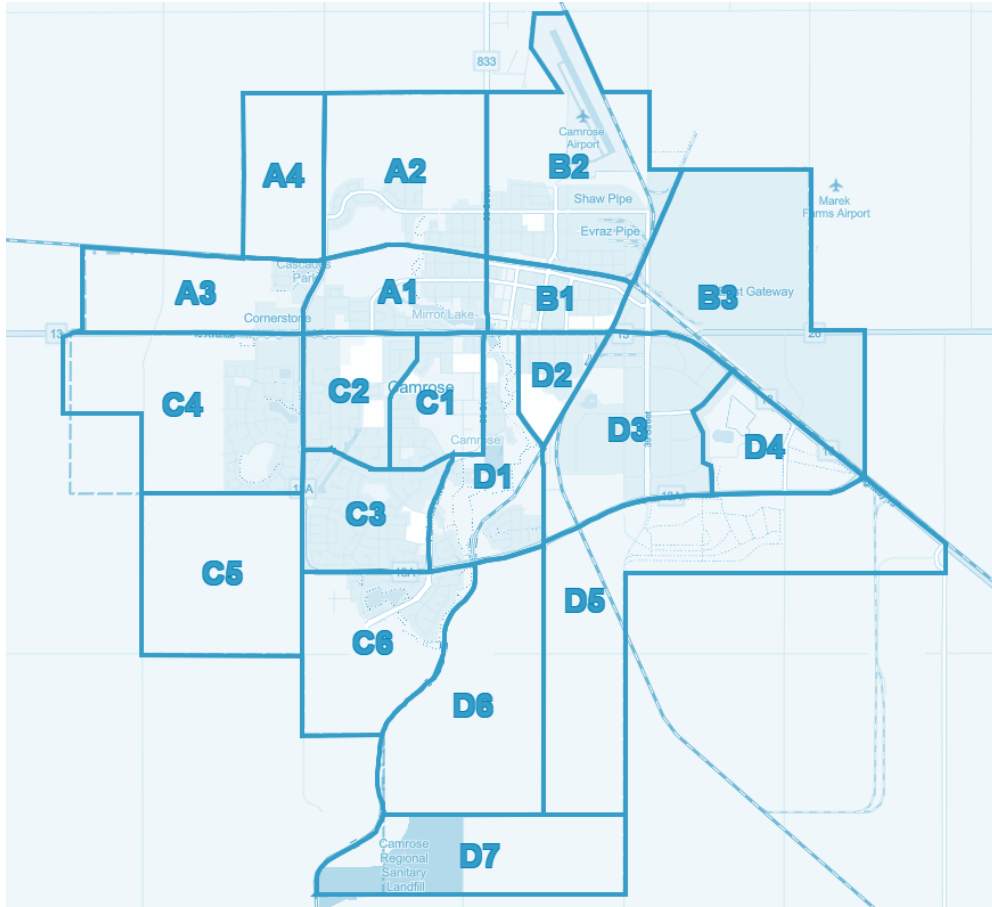
5 Year Average - 27



Break & Enter and Theft

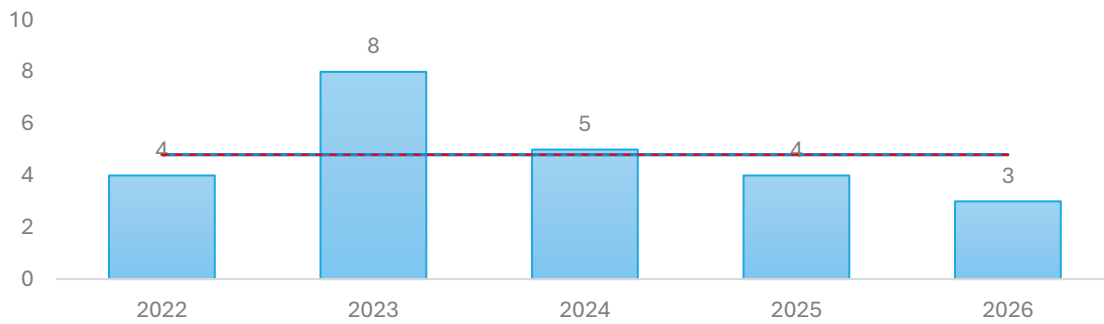
Occurrence Zones





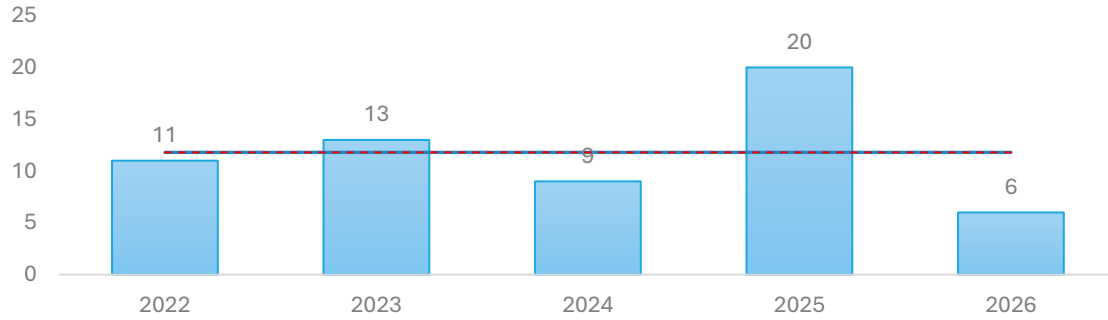
Theft of Motor Vehicle

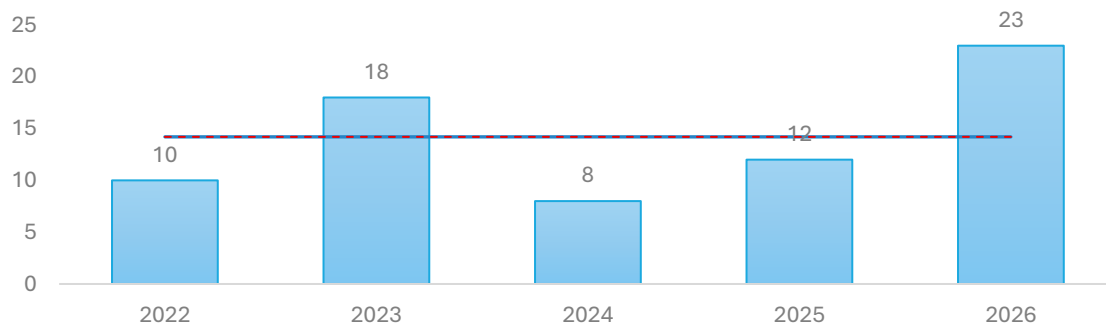

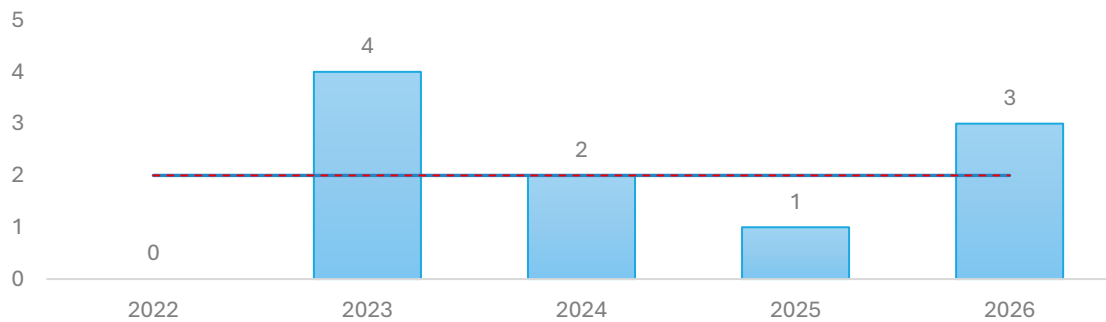

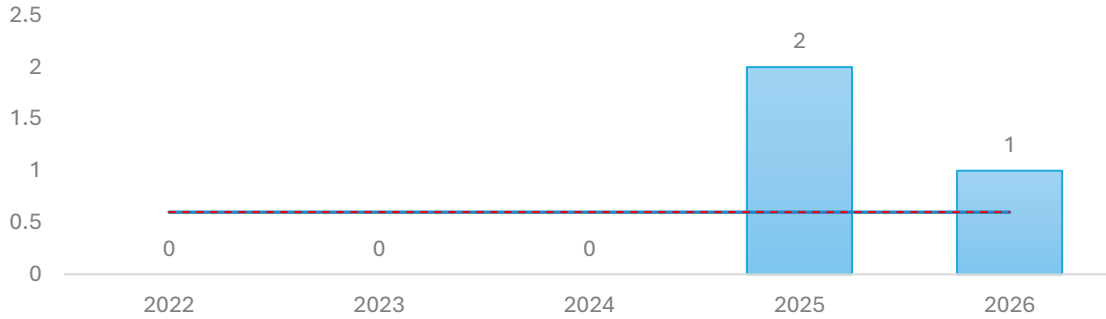

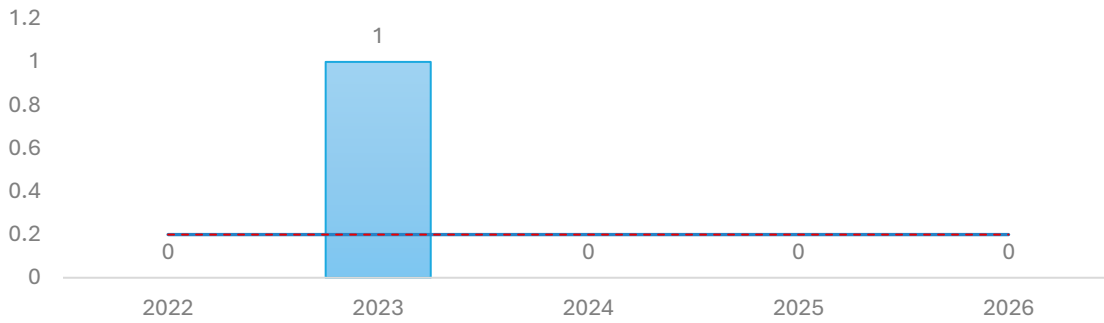

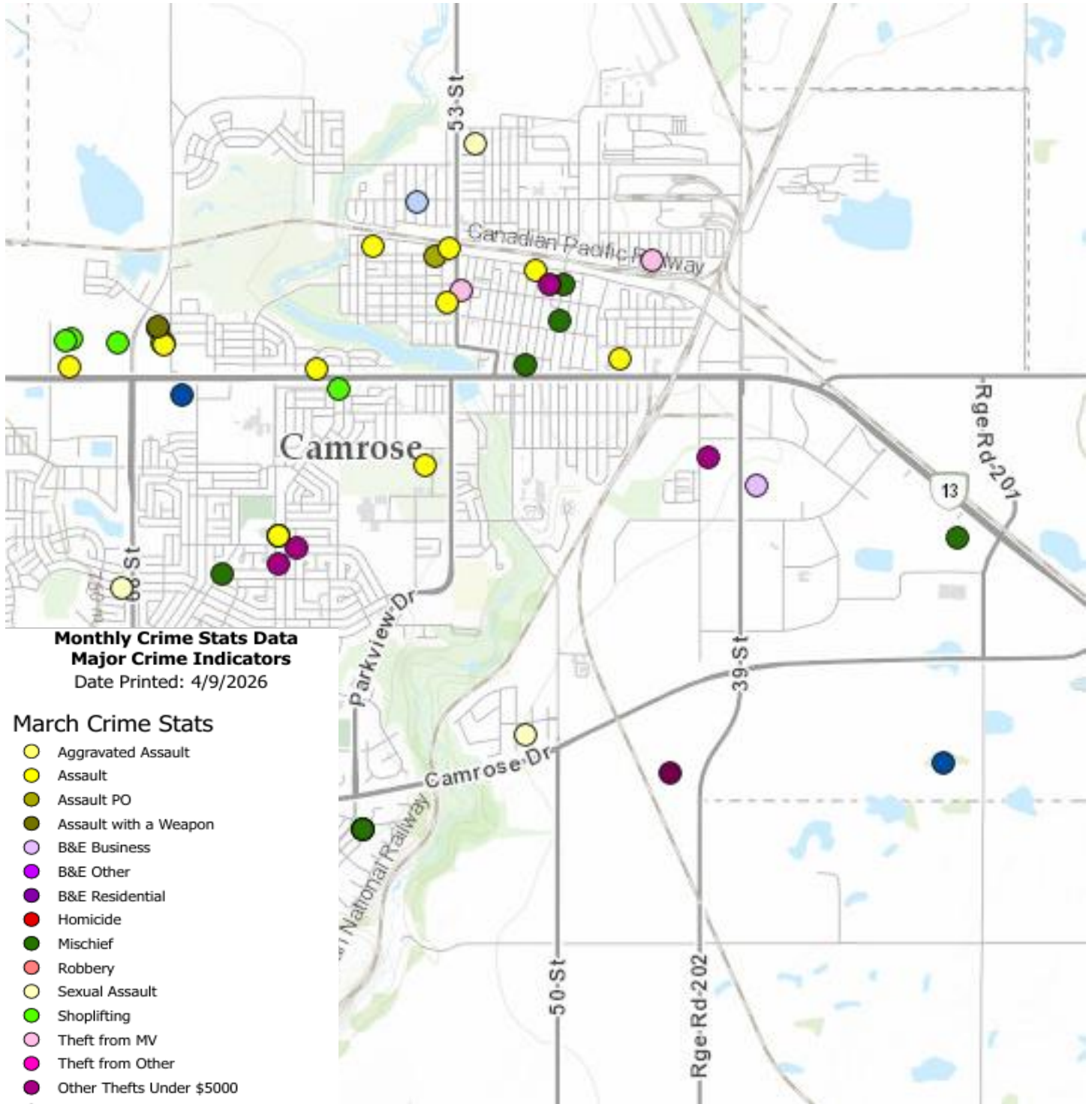

March 2026 Eight Crime Indicators Map

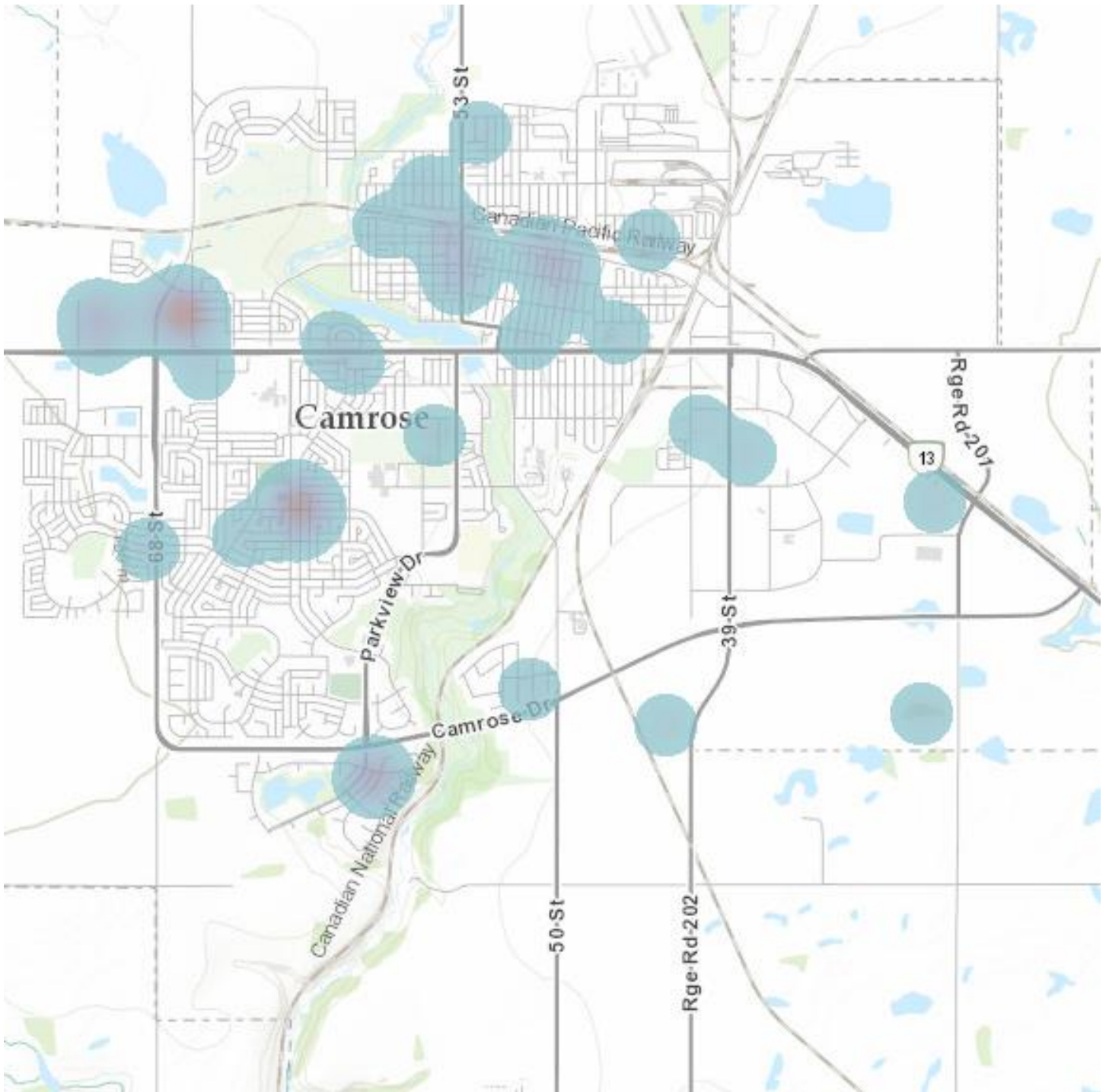

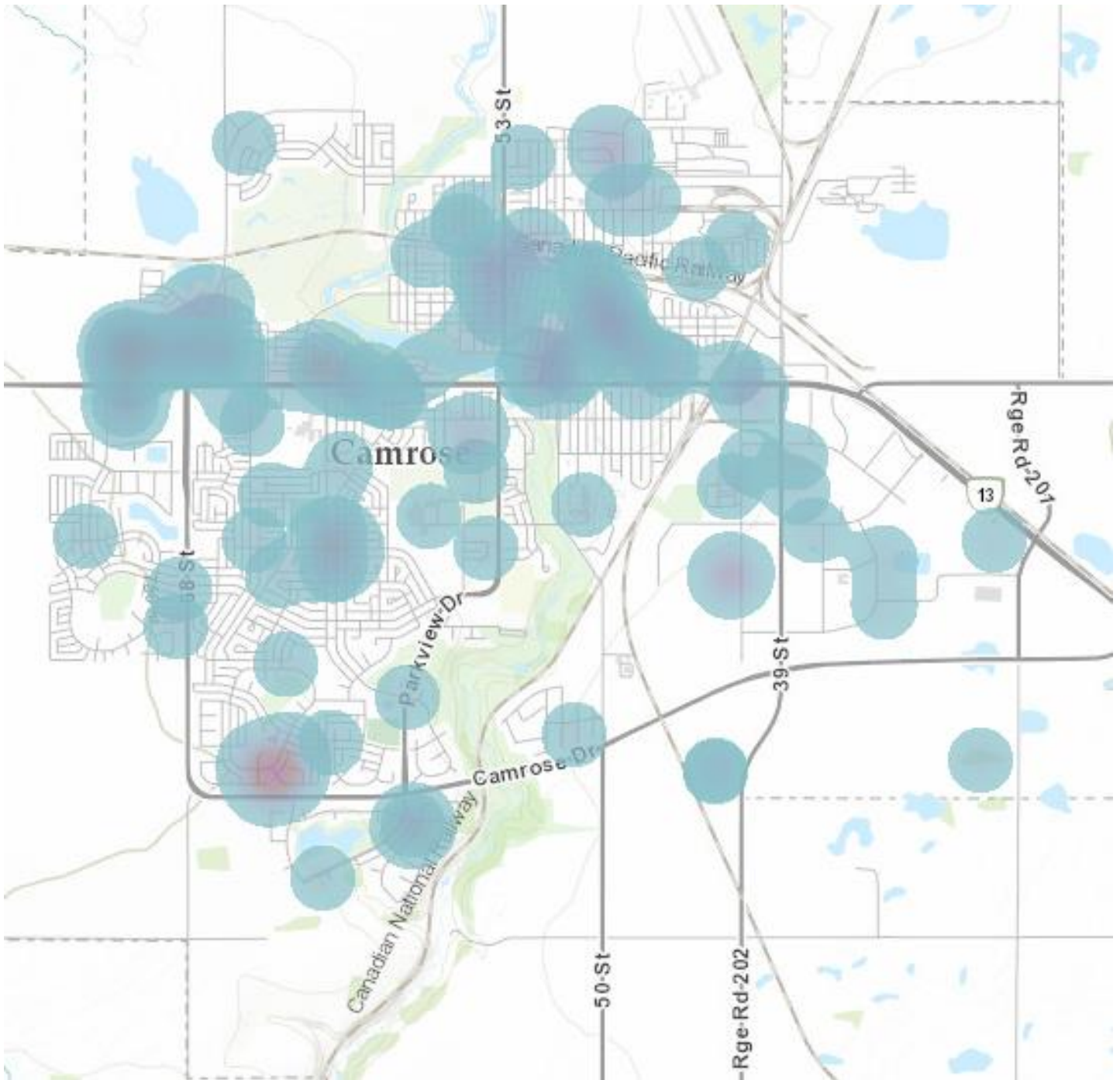

Eight Crime Indicators Heat Map – March 2026

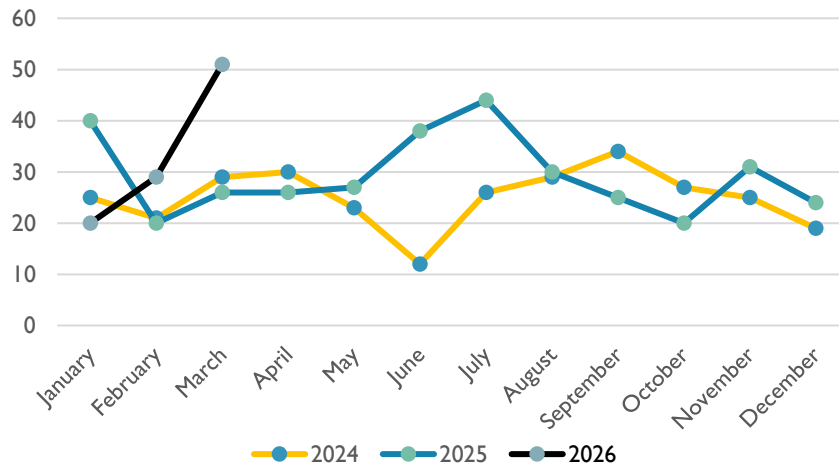


Eight Crime Indicators Heat Map for 1st Quarter January – March, 2026



Crimes Against Persons

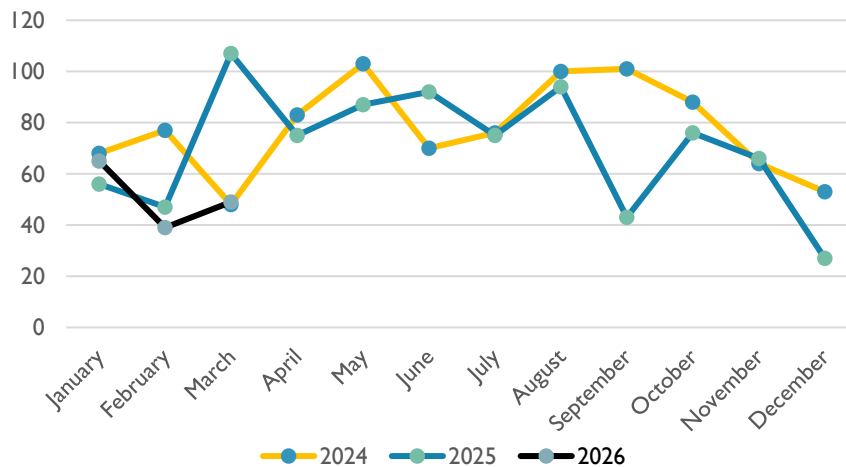
5 Year Monthly Average – 33

Crimes Against Property

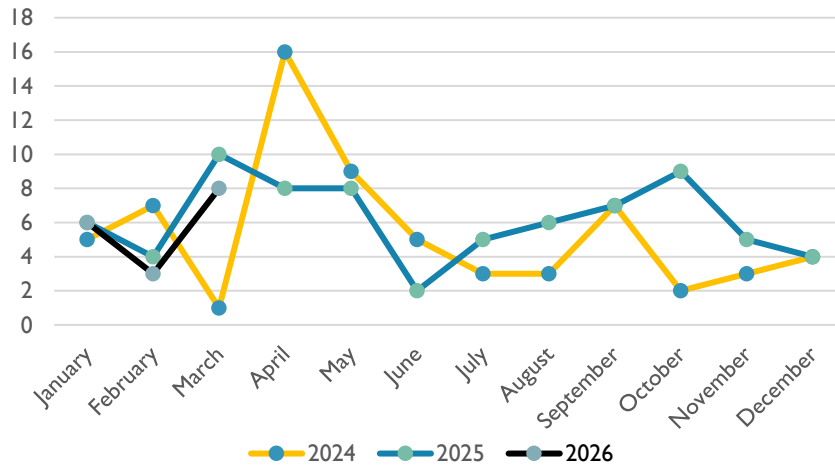
5 Year Monthly Average – 67

Drug Occurrences

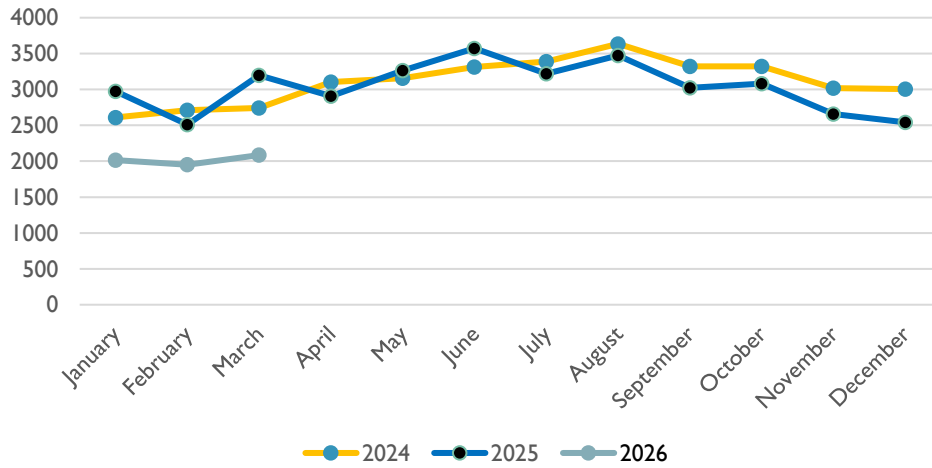
5 Year Monthly Average – 6



There were 8 drug offence occurrences in March of 2026, compared to 10 occurrences in March of 2025, and 1 occurrence in March of 2024.

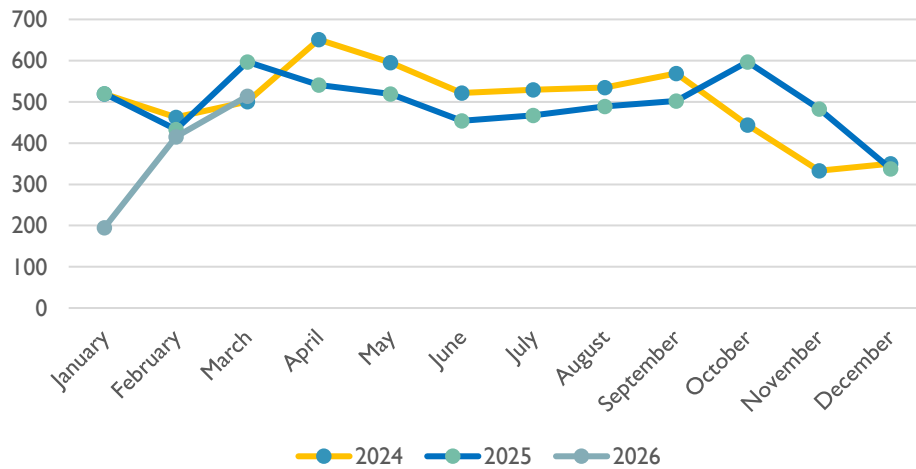

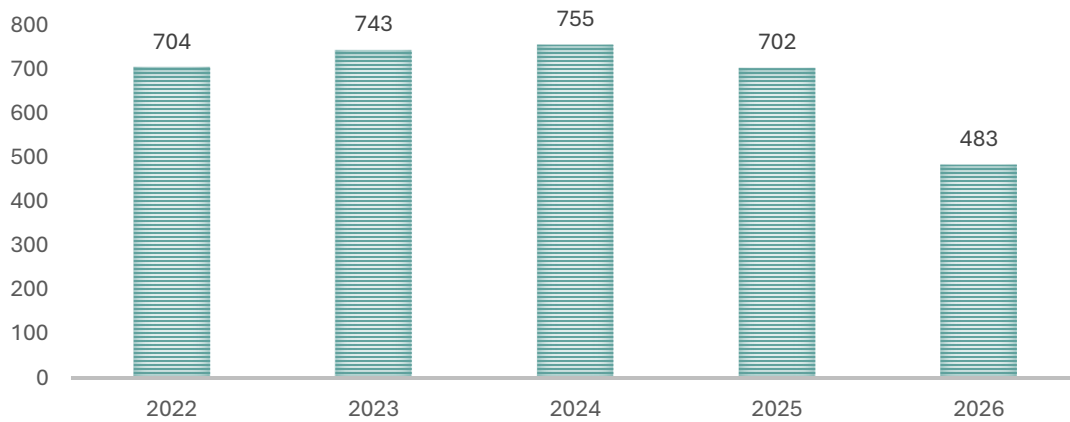

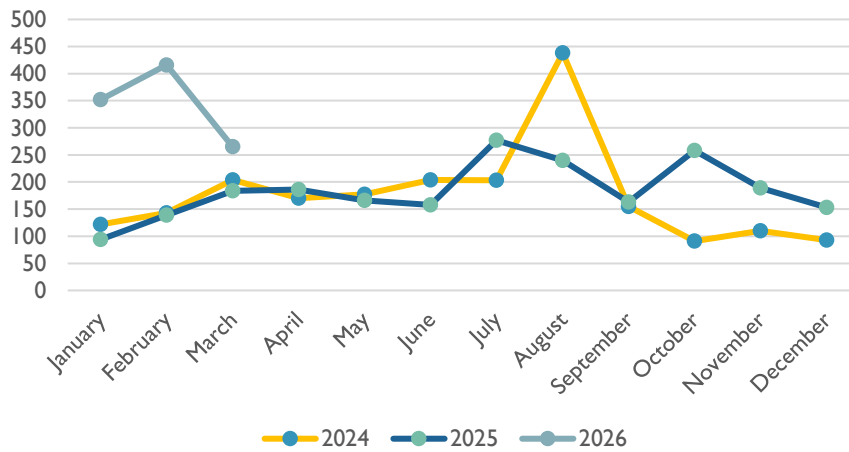

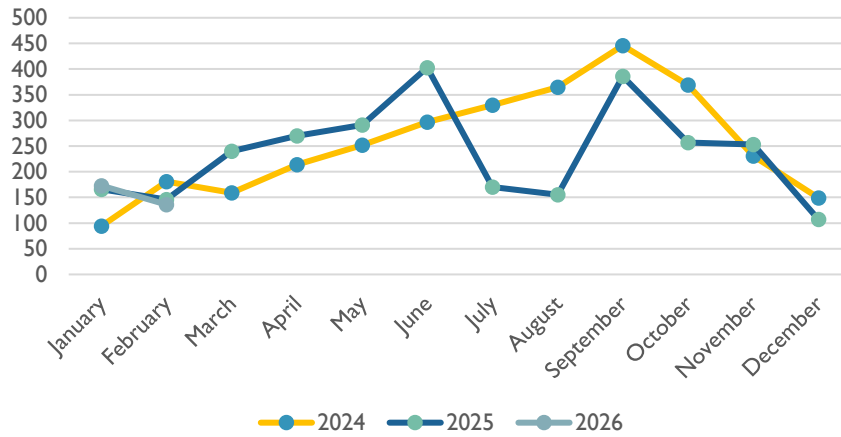

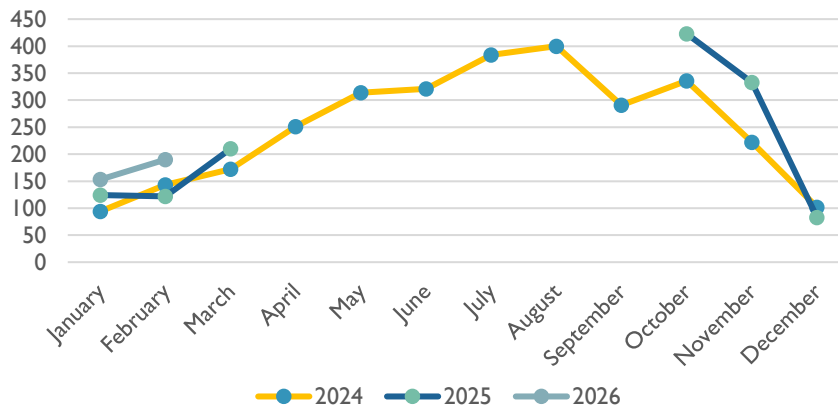

The Intersection Safety Device located at 68 Street & 48 Avenue was effective from February 1, 2020, however was not operational from April 1, 2025 to October 9, 2025. The device was reactivated on October 10, 2025.

“Mandatory Alcohol Screening” (MAS) Statistics

In March 2026, officers conducted 17 **Mandatory Alcohol Screening (MAS)** tests, resulting in 7 **charges** under the **Immediate Roadside Sanctions (IRS)** program. One charge was issued under the **Alberta Zero Alcohol Tolerance (AZAT)** provisions for Graduated Driver Licensing participants, and no **24-hour suspensions** were recorded. Overall, **47% of all drivers tested** were found to be in contravention of applicable alcohol-related sanctions.

There were also no impaired by alcohol or drug occurrences during the month.

Drug Impaired Driving Tests

During the month of March 2026 there were 1 **Standard Field Sobriety Tests (SFST)** and 2 **Drug Recognition Evaluation Test (DRE)** performed.
