Data contained in this report is derived from police Records Management Systems (RMS), Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD), and internal statistical tracking. Occurrence counts reflect reported incidents and may be subject to change as investigations continue or late reports are received.

## Executive Summary:

The April 2026 total for the eight crime indicators increased by 10% compared to March 2026, but remains 19% below the five-year average for the same month.

Notable fluctuations were observed in the categories of mischief, assault, and sexual assault.

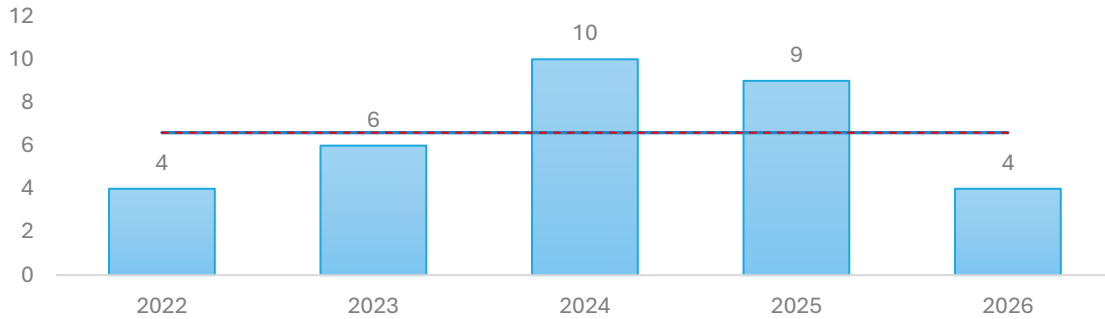
Mischief incidents doubled compared to the previous month; however, levels remain consistent with the five-year average. This increase included a series of eight incidents involving smashed mirrors and windows on parked vehicles, believed to have occurred within a similar timeframe.

Assaults decreased significantly, dropping 52% from the March 2026 total and returning to levels in line with the five-year average after the spike observed the previous month.

The increase in sexual assault incidents in April 2026 appears significant, but it does not fully reflect a sudden rise in activity. The data represents the number of reported offences and was influenced by a report of intimate partner violence involving incidents that occurred over an extended period.

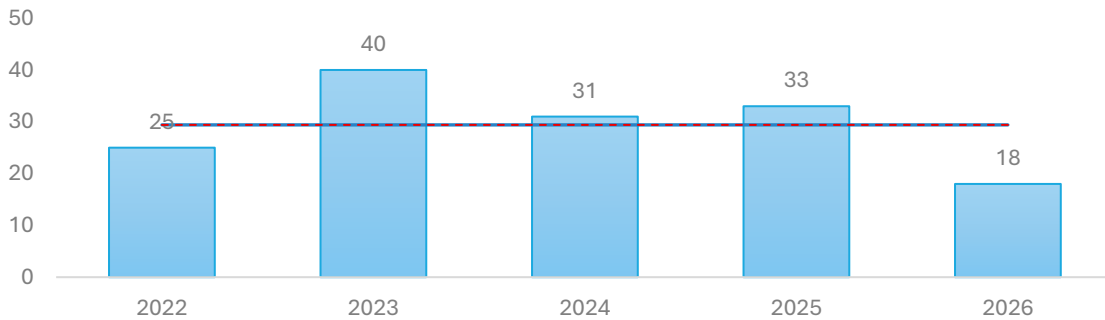

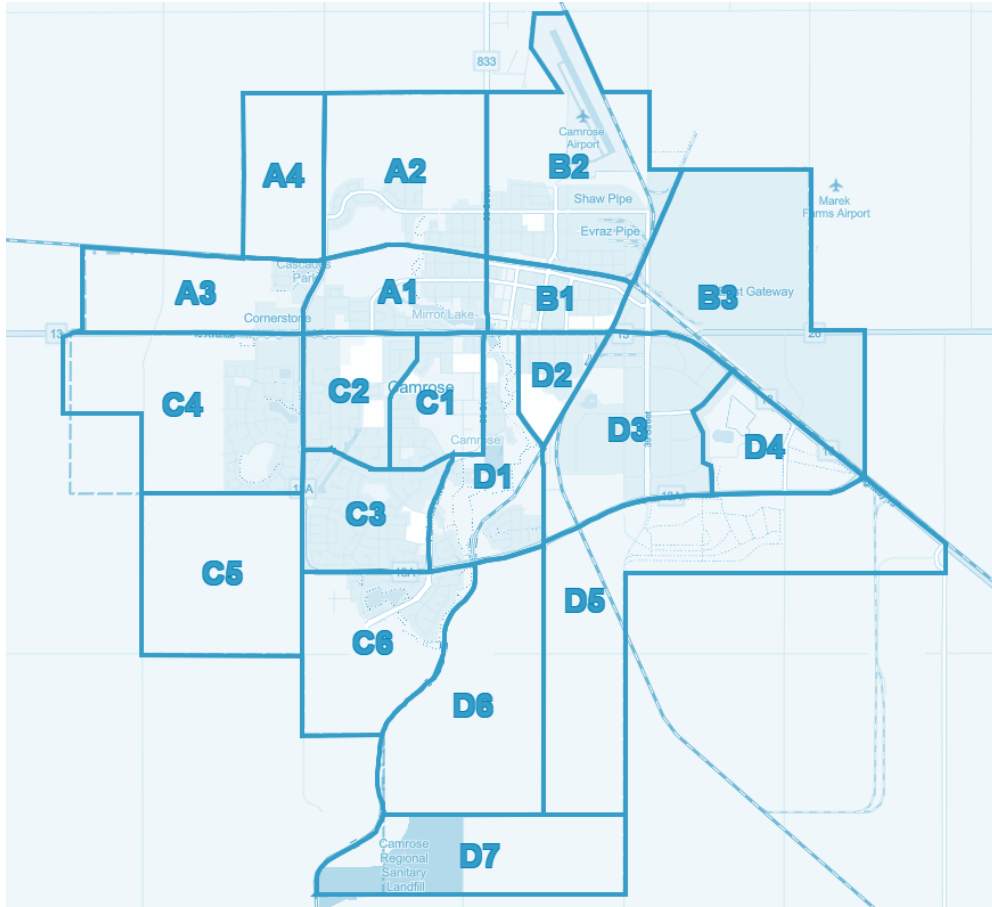

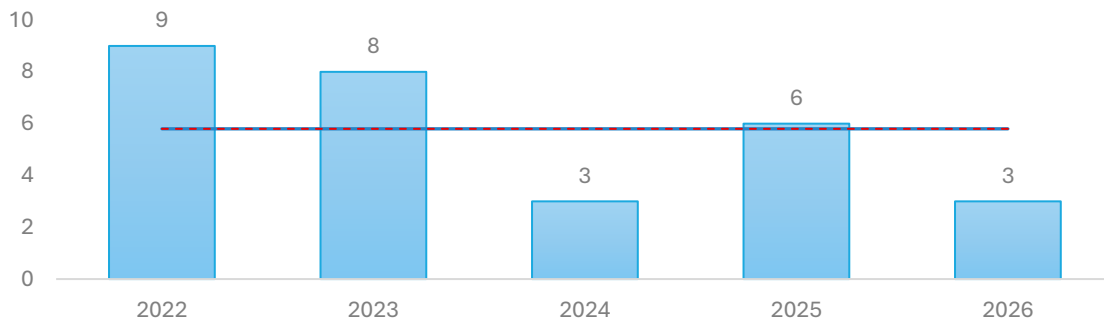
Occurrence Zones





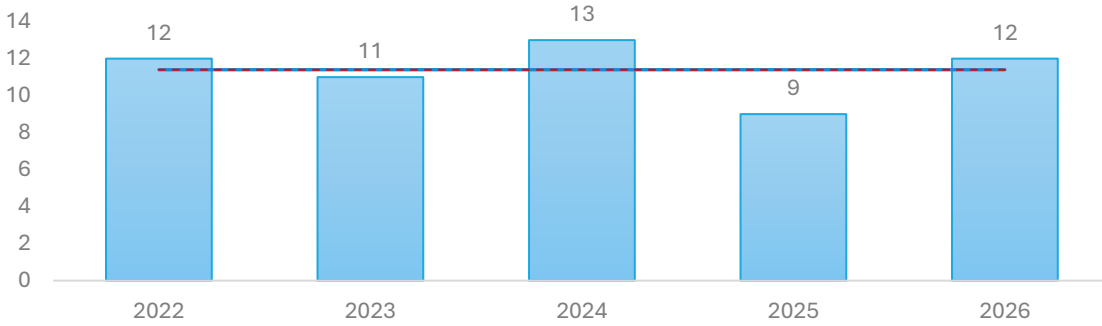
# Theft of Motor Vehicle

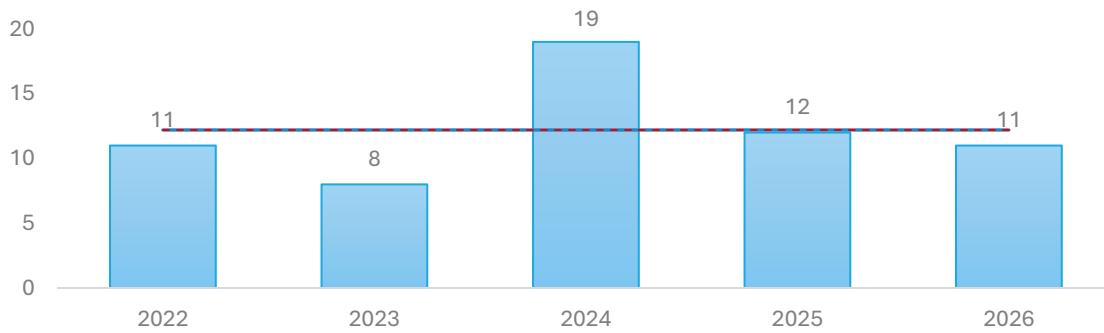

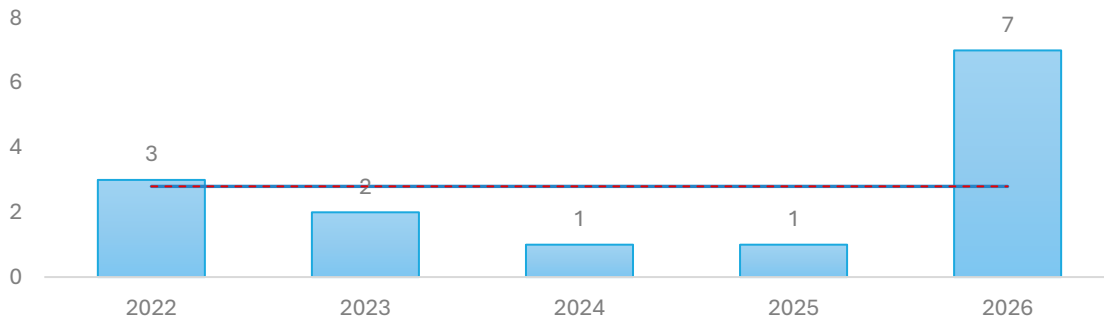

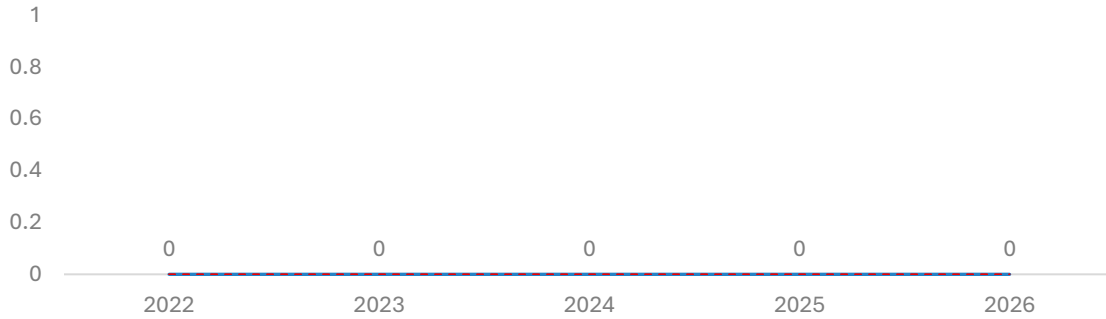

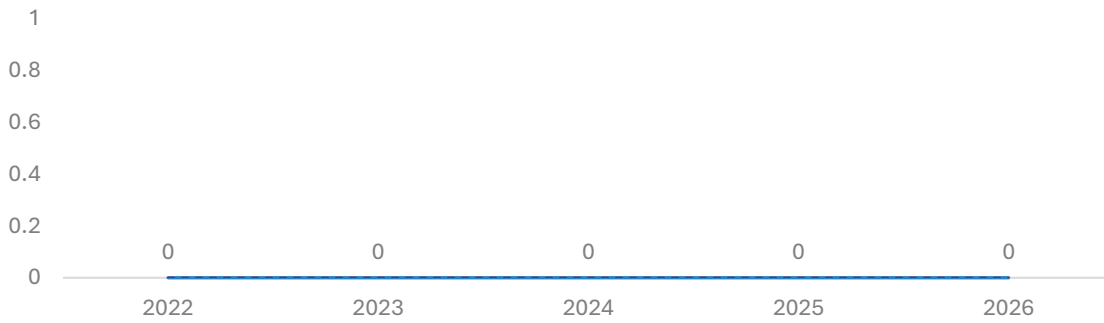

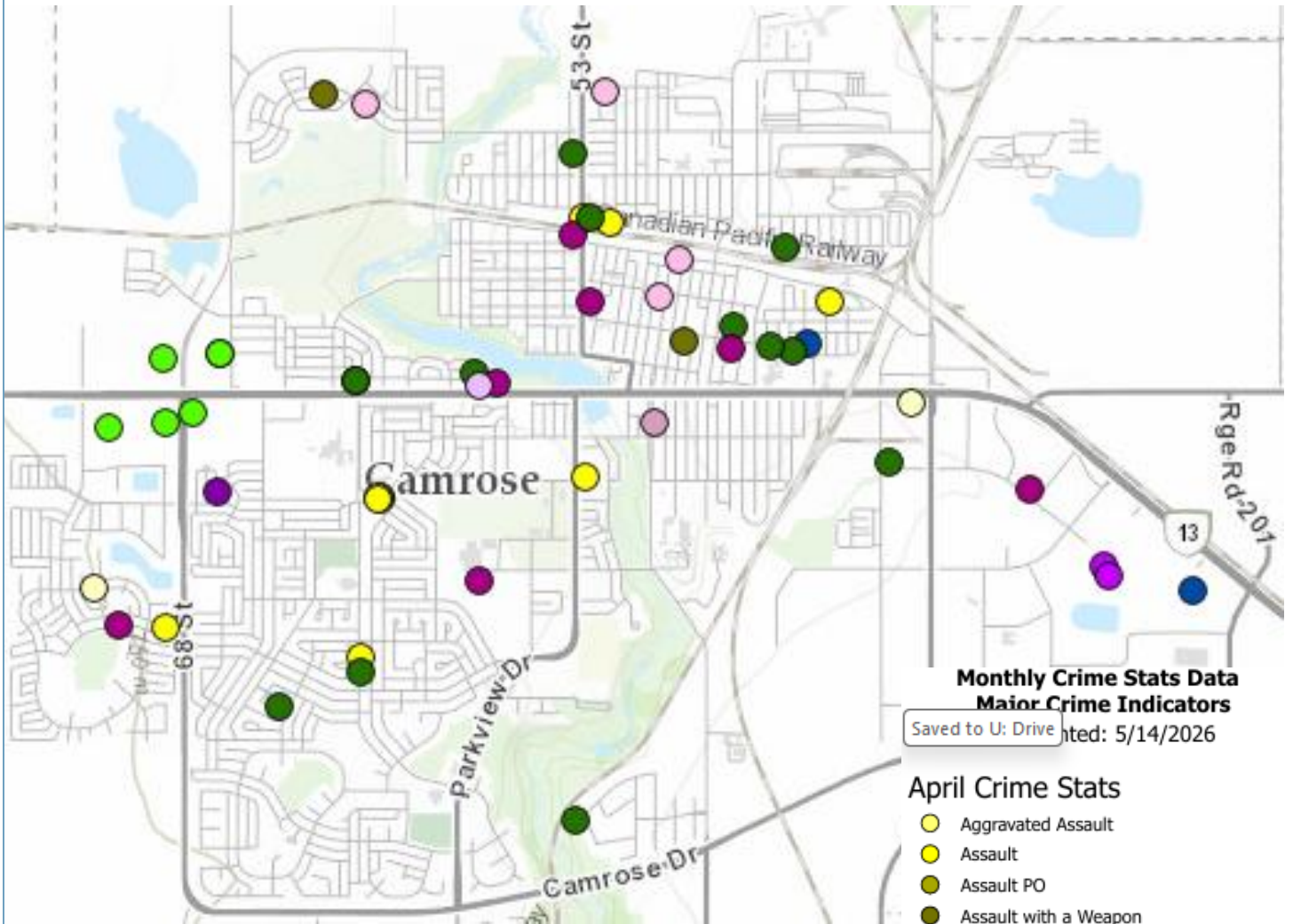

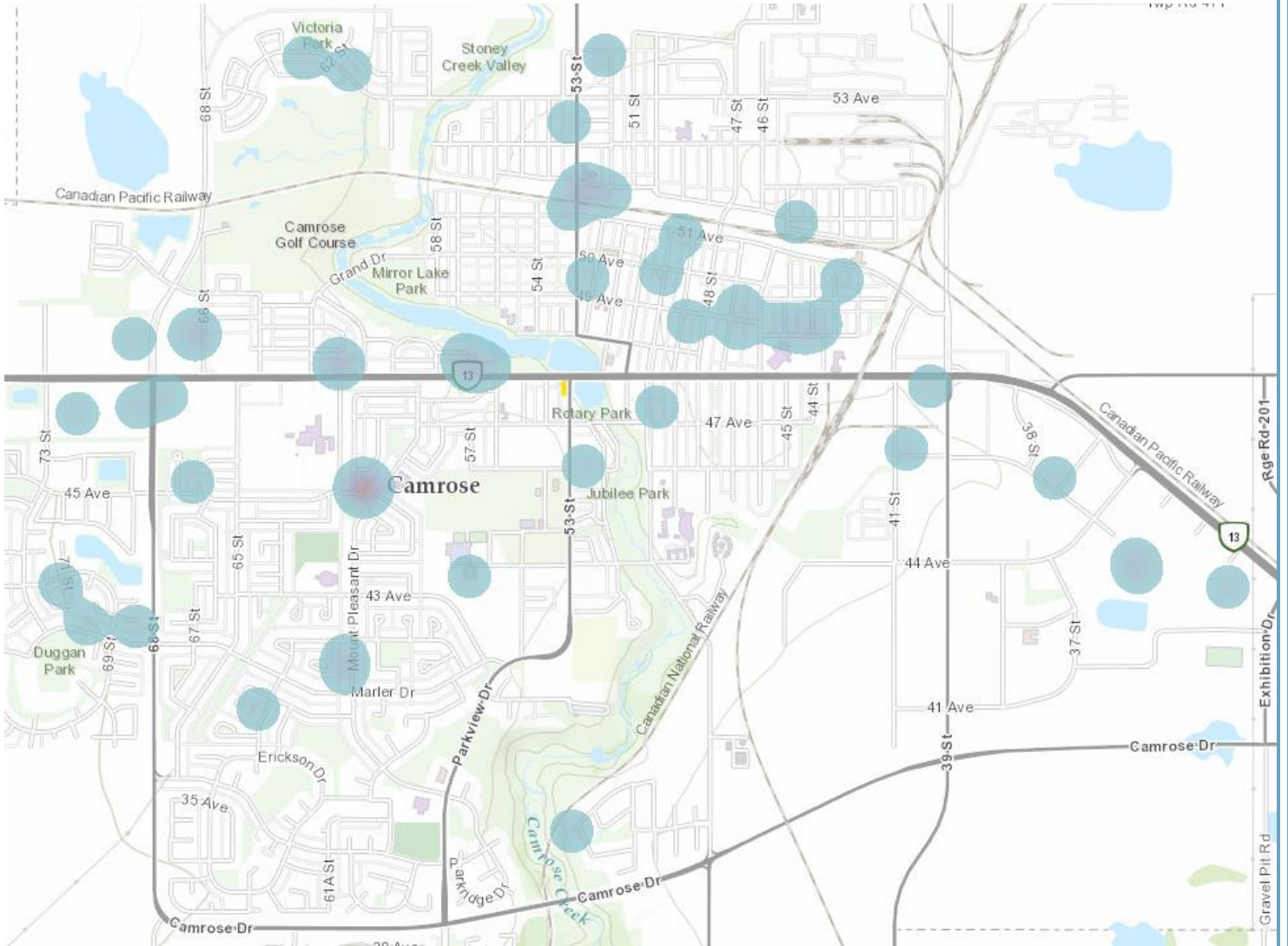
# April 2026 Eight Crime Indicators Map



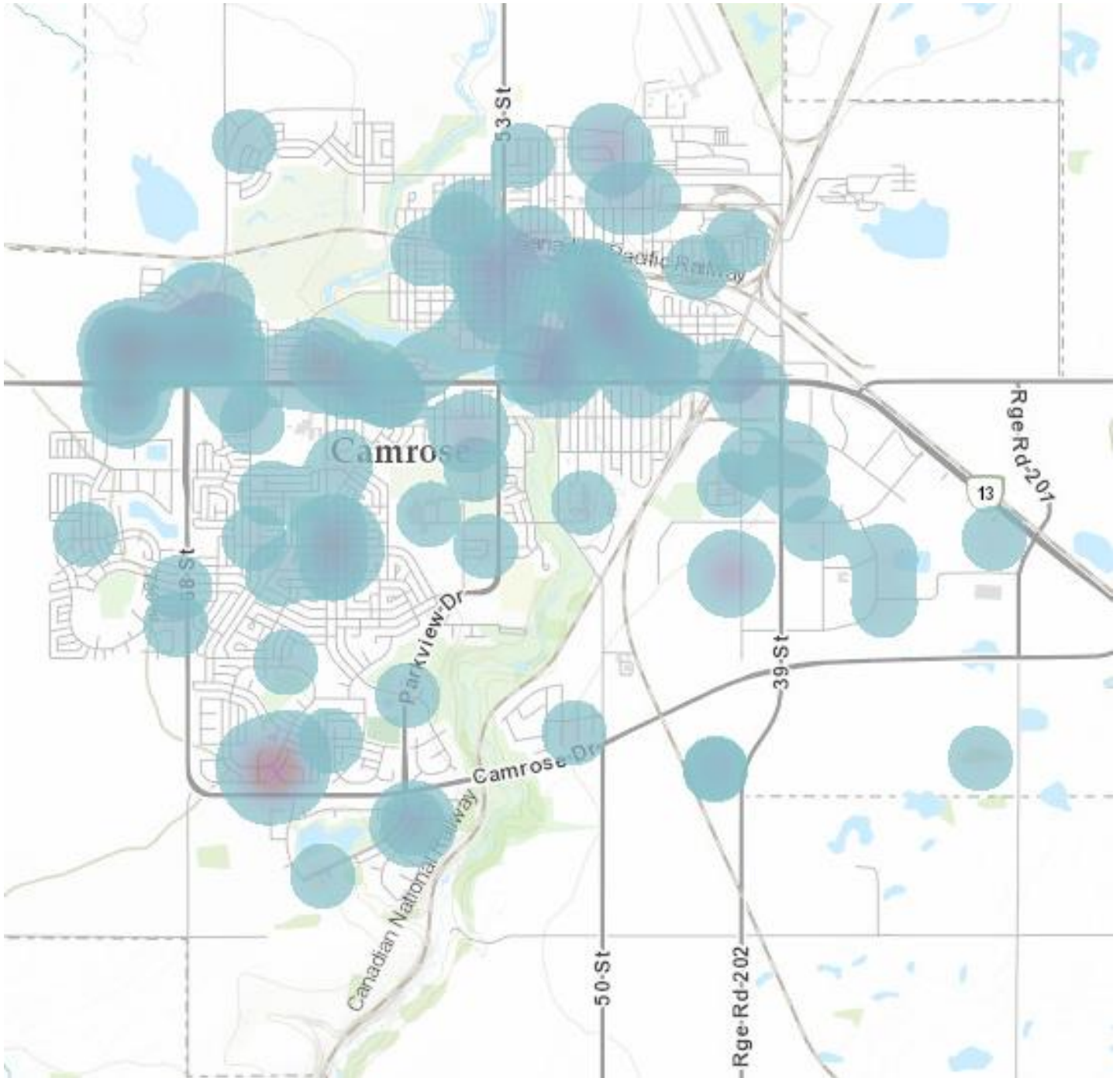

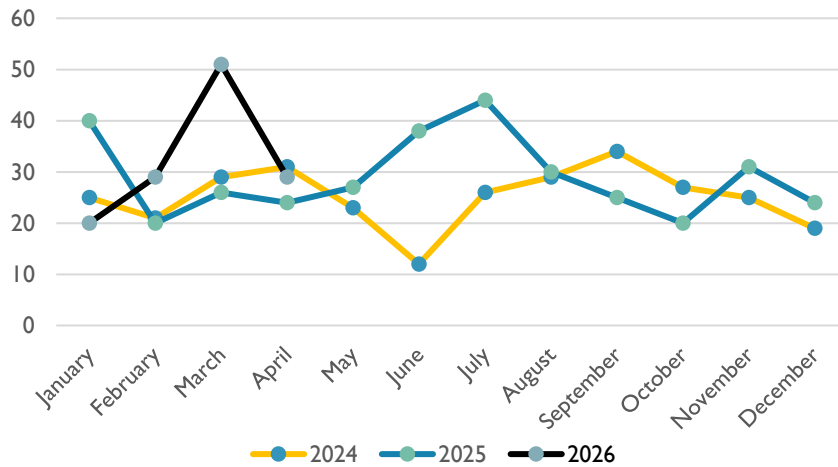


# Eight Crime Indicators Heat Map for 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter January – March, 2026



# Crimes Against Persons

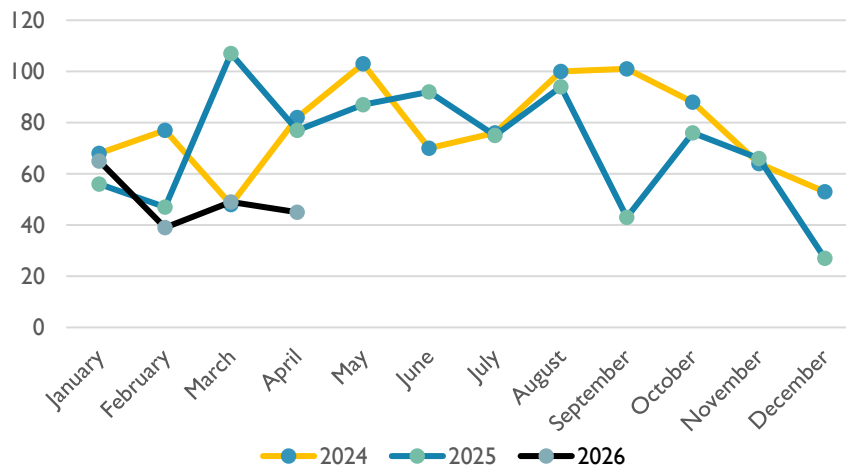
5 Year Monthly Average – 29

# Crimes Against Property

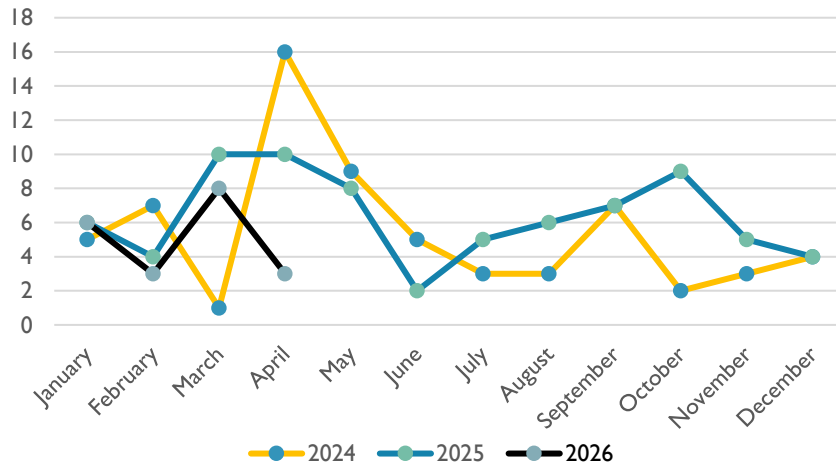
5 Year Monthly Average – 69

# Drug Occurrences

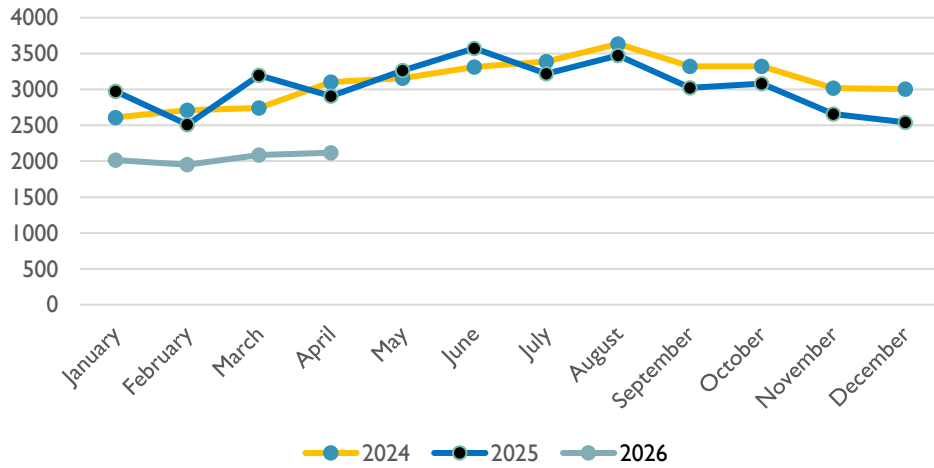
5 Year Monthly Average – 7



There were 3 drug offence occurrences in April of 2026, compared to 10 occurrences in April of 2025, and 16 occurrences in April of 2024.

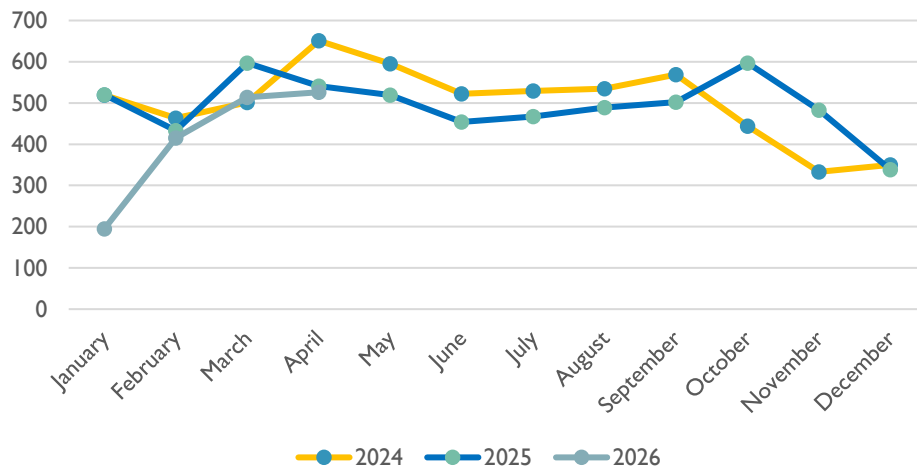

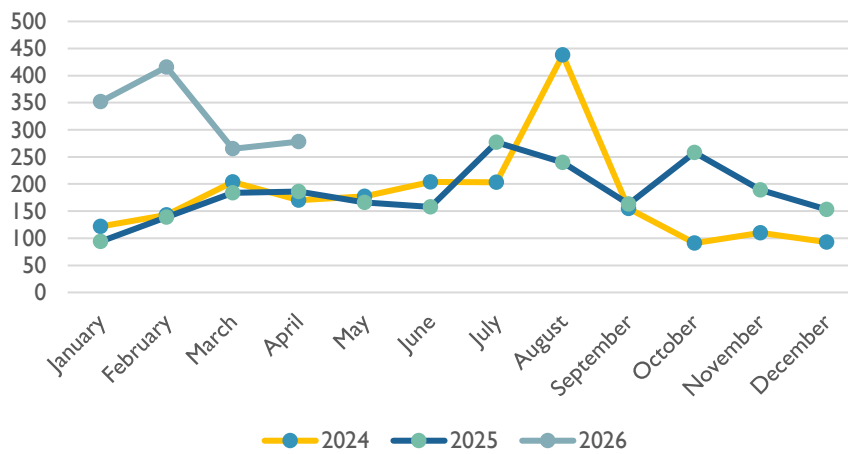

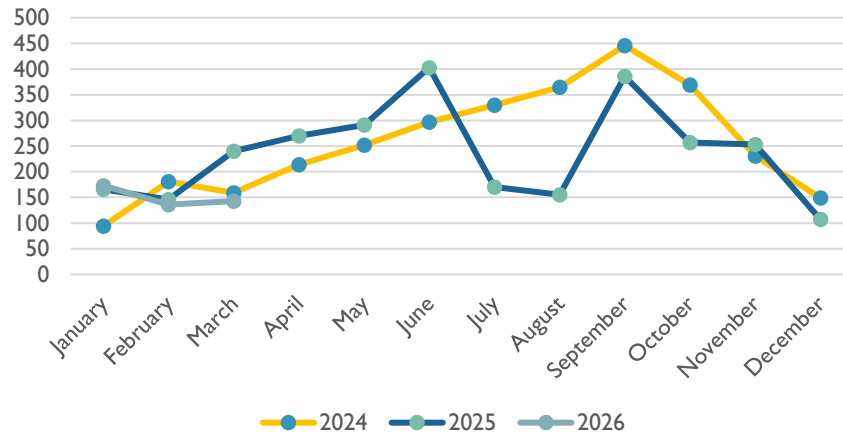

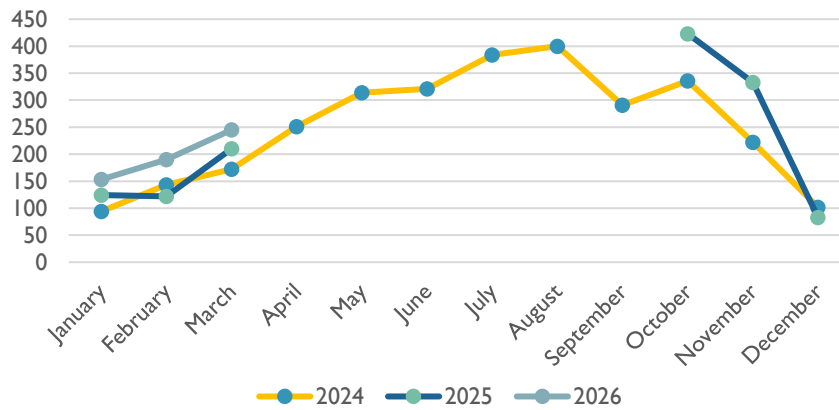

The Intersection Safety Device located at 68 Street & 48 Avenue was effective from February 1, 2020, however was not operational from April 1, 2025 to October 9, 2025. The device was reactivated on October 10, 2025.

## **“Mandatory Alcohol Screening” (MAS) Statistics**

In April 2026, officers conducted **19 Mandatory Alcohol Screening (MAS)** tests, resulting in **5 charges** under the **Immediate Roadside Sanctions (IRS)** program. **One** charge was issued under the **Alberta Zero Alcohol Tolerance (AZAT)** provisions for Graduated Driver Licensing participants, and **two 24-hour suspensions** were recorded. Overall, **42% of all drivers tested** were found to be in contravention of applicable alcohol-related sanctions.

There were no impaired by alcohol or drug occurrences during the month.

## **Drug Impaired Driving Tests**

In the month of April 2026 there was **1 Standard Field Sobriety Tests (SFST)** and **no Drug Recognition Evaluation Test (DRE)** performed.
