## **Executive Summary:**

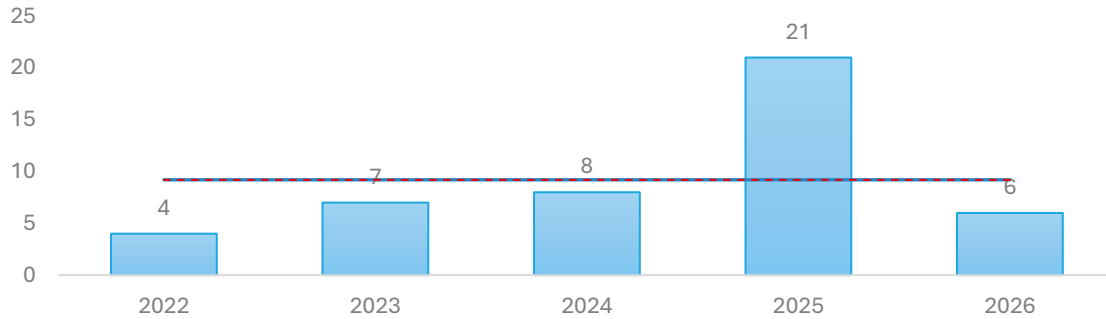
In May 2026, the eight crime indicators remained notably lower than both the spike observed in May 2025 and the five-year average, reflecting continued positive trends, particularly property-related offences.

The elevated levels in May 2025 were primarily driven by a concentrated series of garage break-and-enters involving theft, property damage, and motor vehicle thefts, which significantly increased several of the indicators.

Overall, the expected seasonal rise in crime decreased significantly and remains well below historical levels.

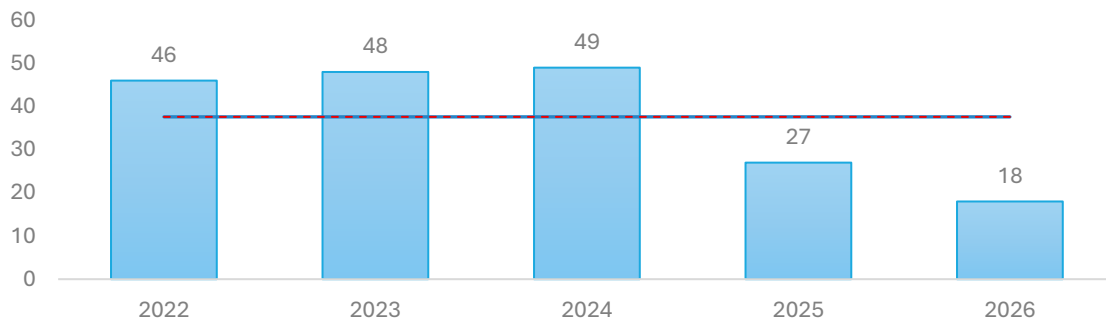

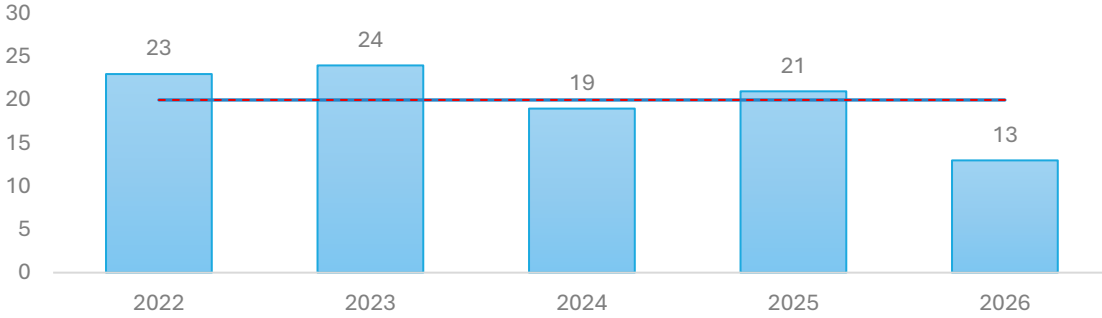
Occurrence Zones





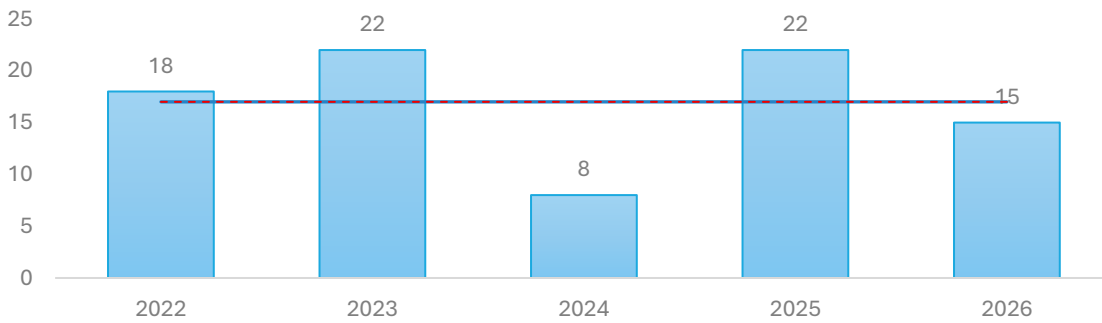

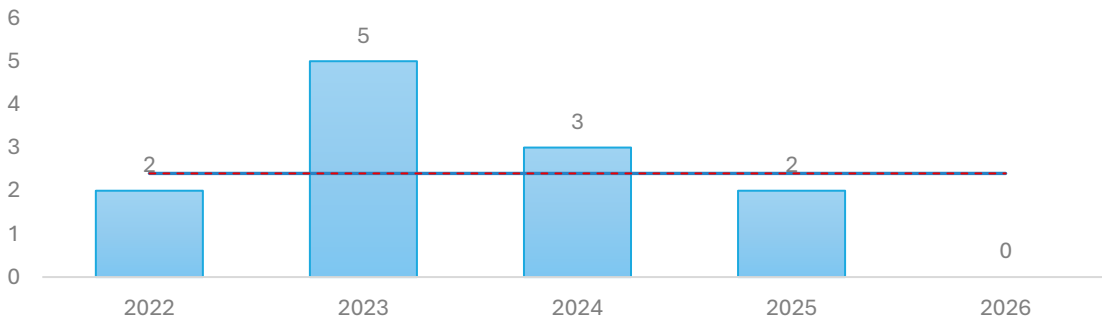

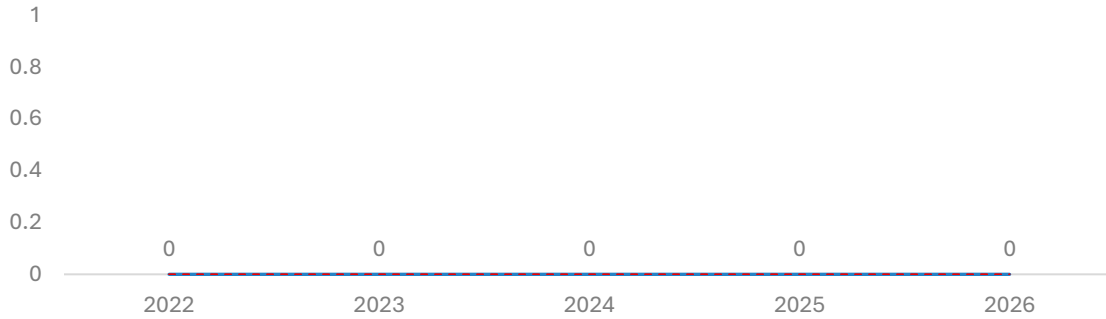

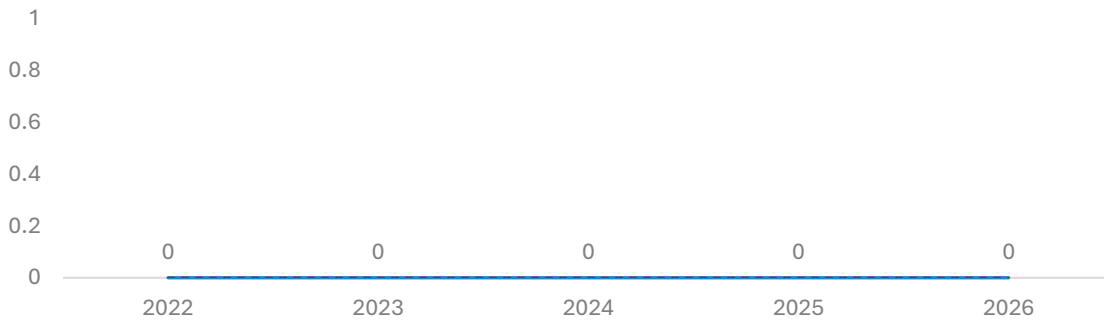

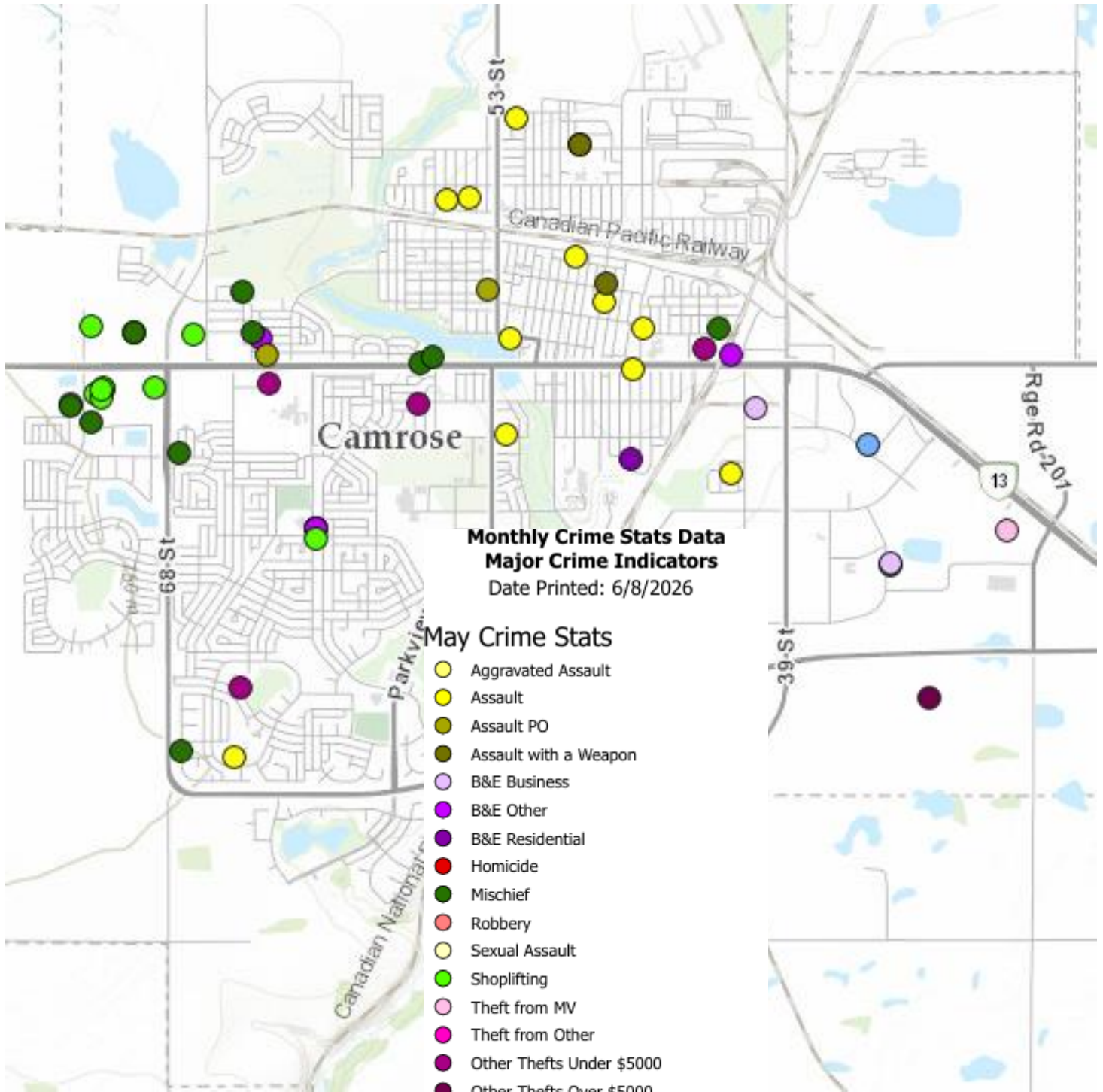

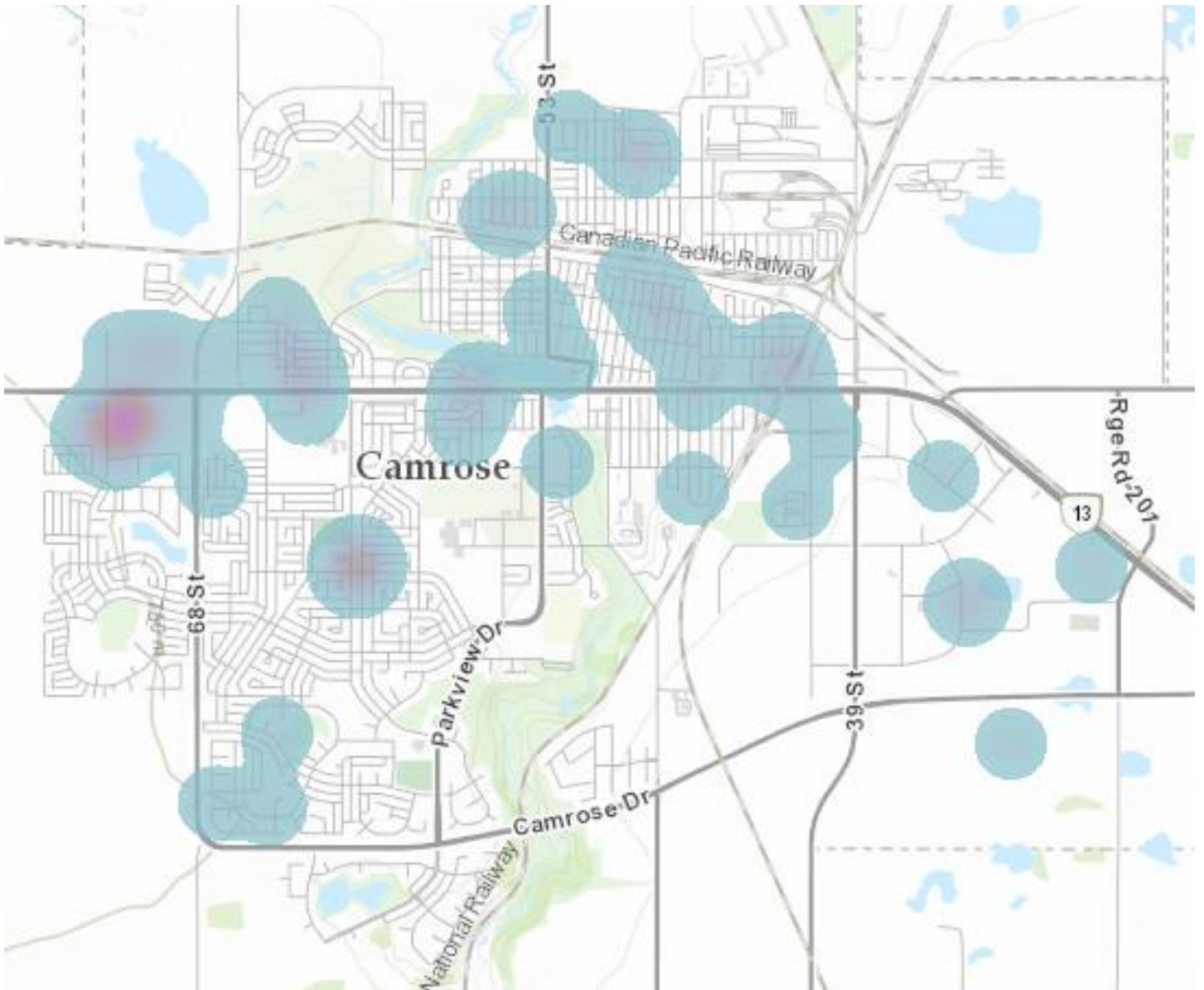

# May 2026 Eight Crime Indicators Map



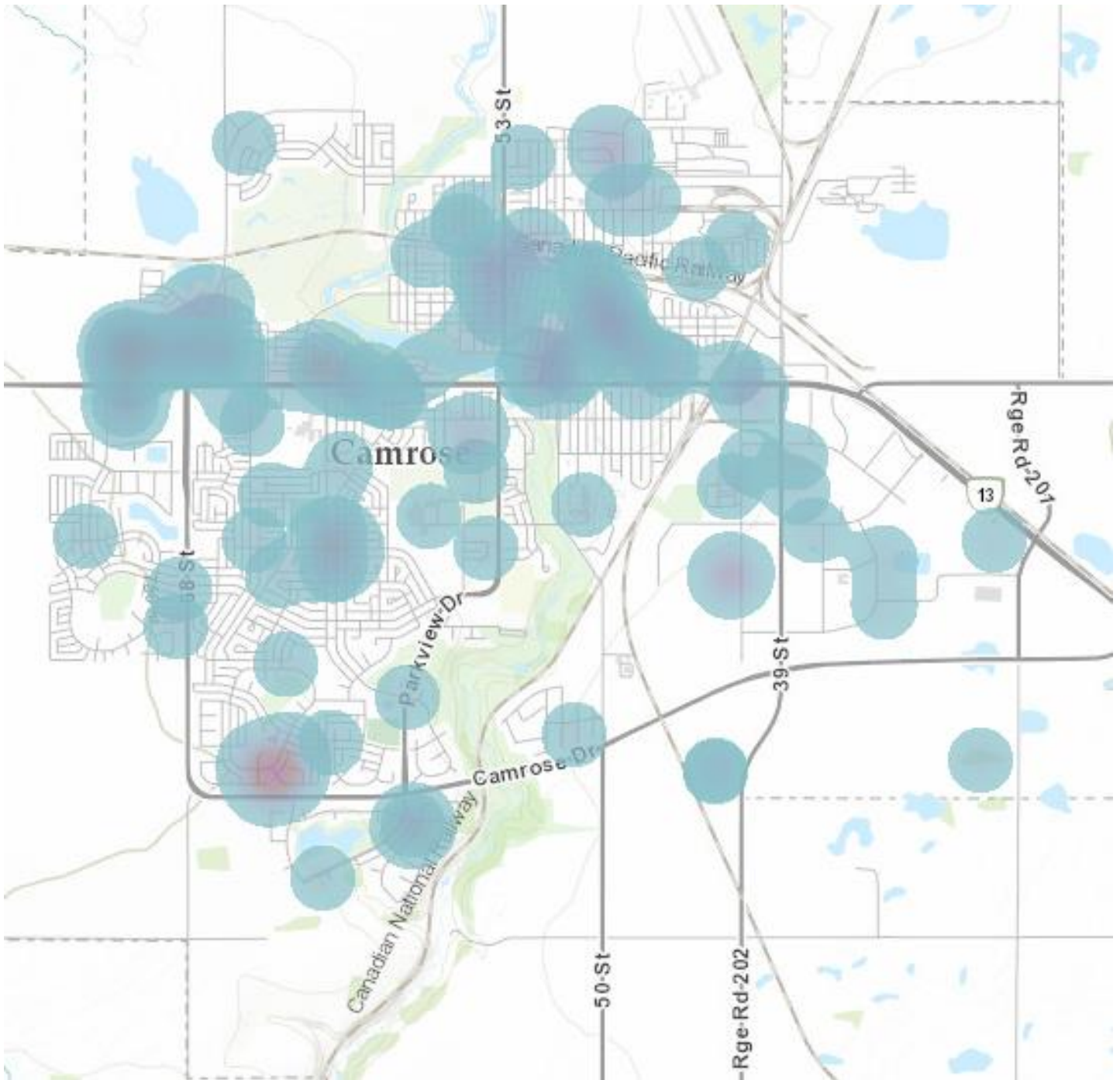
# Eight Crime Indicators Heat Map – May 2026

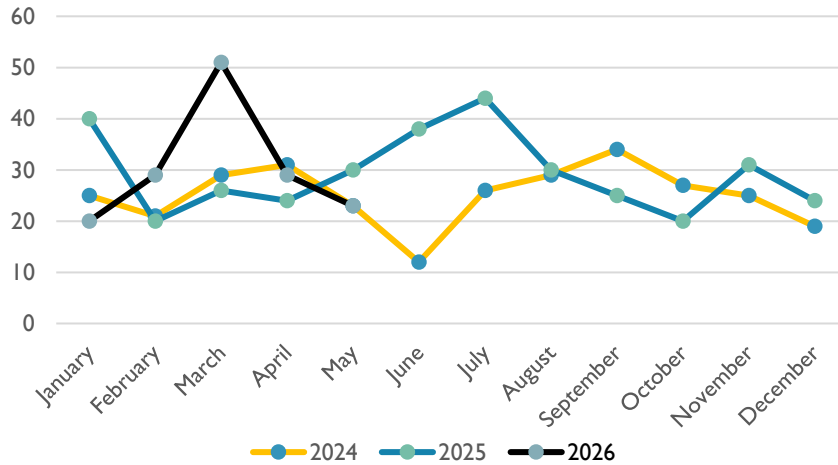

# Crimes Against Persons

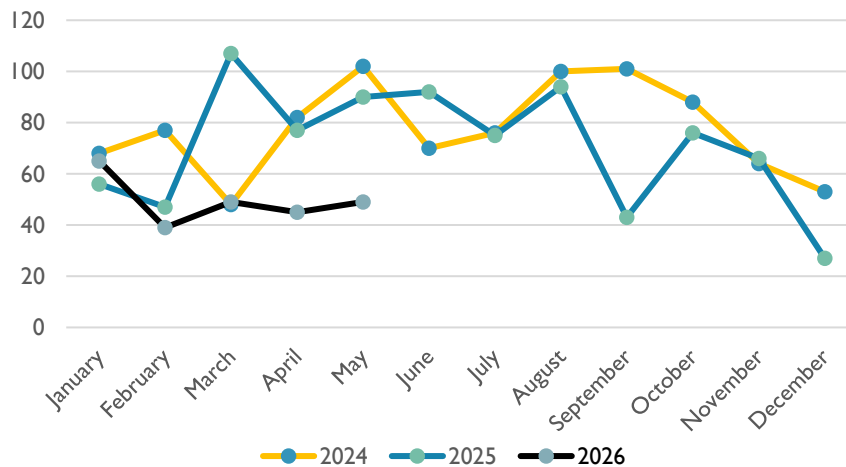
5 Year Monthly Average – 30

# Crimes Against Property

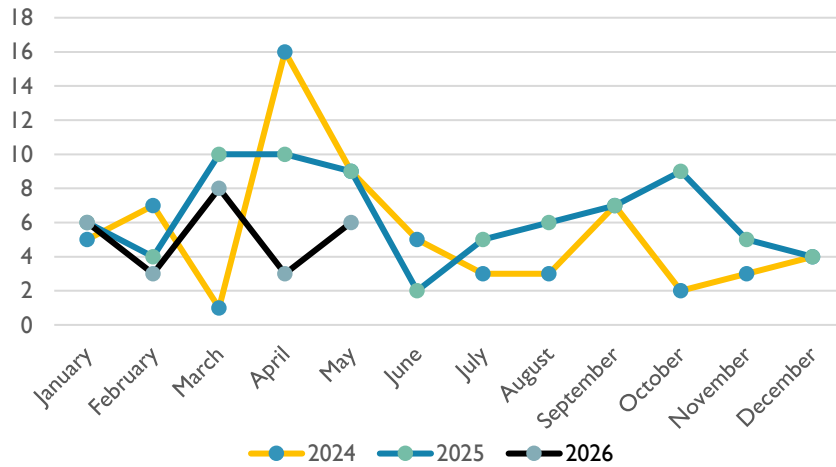
5 Year Monthly Average – 89

# Drug Occurrences

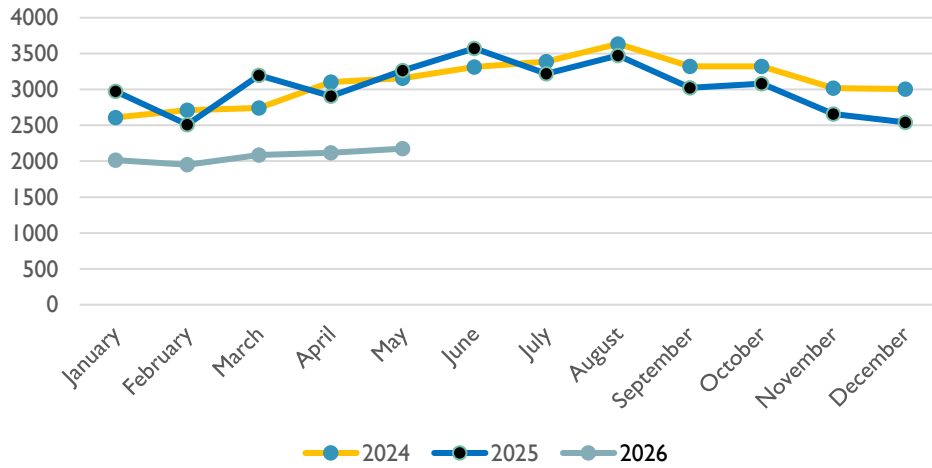
5 Year Monthly Average – 9



There were 6 drug offence occurrences in May of 2026, compared to 9 occurrences in both May of 2025 and May of 2024.

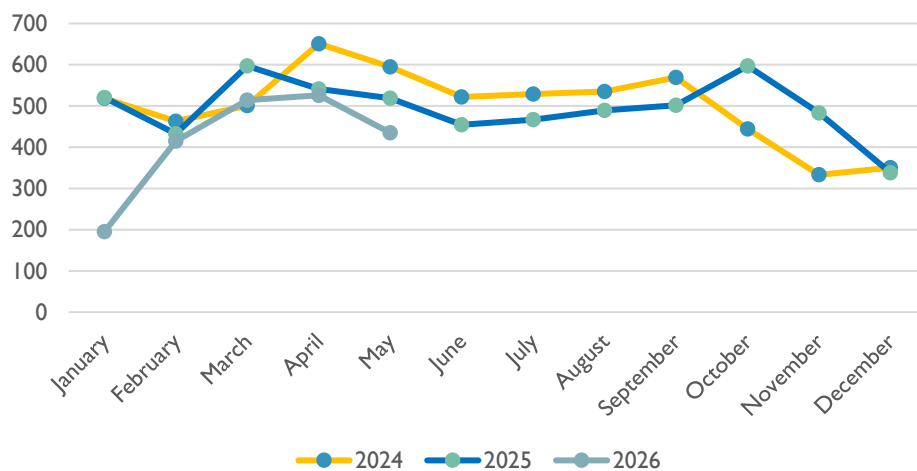

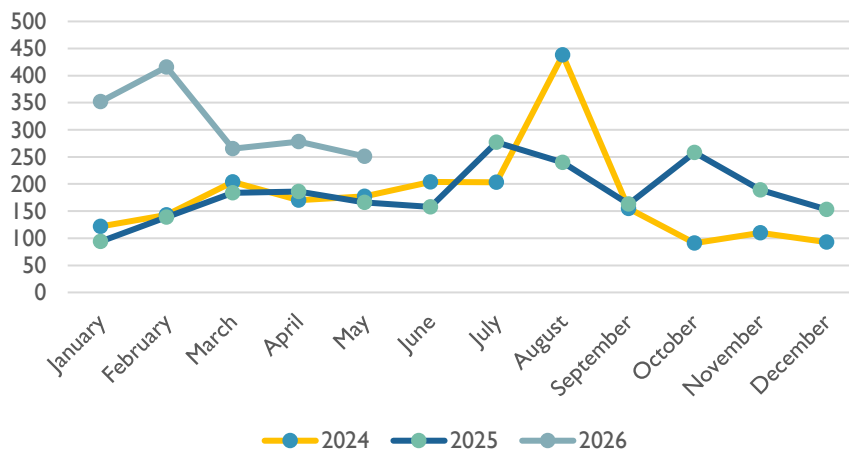

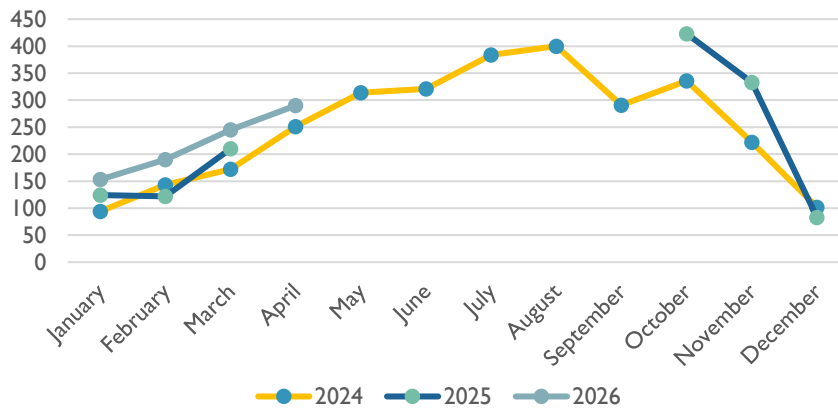

The Intersection Safety Device located at 68 Street & 48 Avenue was effective from February 1, 2020, however was not operational from April 1, 2025 to October 9, 2025. The device was reactivated on October 10, 2025.

## **“Mandatory Alcohol Screening” (MAS) Statistics**

In May 2026, officers conducted **92 Mandatory Alcohol Screening (MAS)** tests, resulting in **4 charges** under the **Immediate Roadside Sanctions (IRS)** program. No charges were issued under the **Alberta Zero Alcohol Tolerance (AZAT)** provisions for Graduated Driver Licensing participants, and **three 24-hour suspensions** were recorded. Overall, **8% of all drivers tested** were found to be in contravention of applicable alcohol-related sanctions.

There was one impaired by alcohol or drug occurrence during the month.

## **Drug Impaired Driving Tests**

In the month of May 2026 there were no **Standard Field Sobriety Tests (SFST)** or **Drug Recognition Evaluation Test (DRE)** performed.
