Purpose:

The purpose of this report is to provide a standardized monthly analysis of crime trends within the City of Camrose. The report focuses on eight primary crime indicators and presents statistical comparisons, trends, and contextual analysis to support operational decision-making, strategic planning, and community awareness.

Data Sources & Methodology:

Data contained in this report is derived from police Records Management Systems (RMS), Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD), and internal statistical tracking. Occurrence counts reflect reported incidents and may be subject to change as investigations continue or late reports are received.

Executive Summary:

July 2026 recorded 85 incidents across the eight primary crime indicators, an increase from June 2026 (60 incidents), but slightly below July 2025 (88 incidents) and the five-year average (95 incidents).

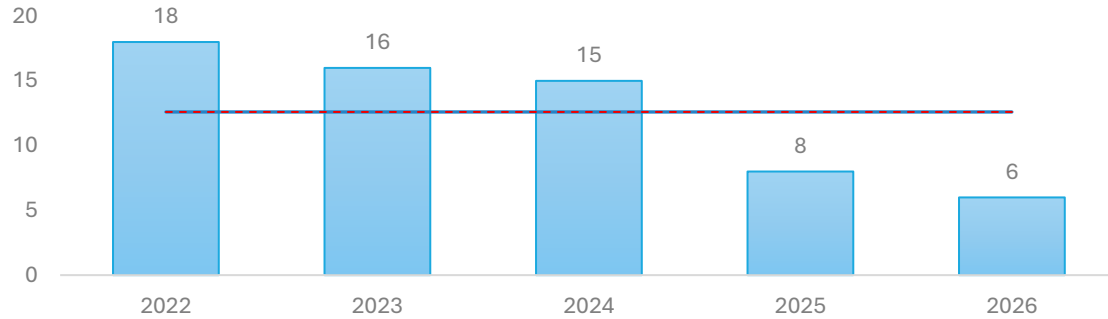
Property crime remained relatively stable, with theft increasing to 33 incidents and motor vehicle thefts rising to 5 incidents, while break and enters remained low at 6 incidents and mischief decreased to 14 incidents, remaining below historical averages.

Crimes against persons continued to trend upward, with 46 incidents reported, including 27 assaults, exceeding both last year's July total and the five-year average. No robberies, sexual assaults, or homicides were reported during the month. A review of the assault occurrences found that 19 incidents involved familial or intimate partner violence, including three repeat offenders, while two additional incidents could not proceed due to the victim declining to participate in the police investigation.

Overall, July 2026 was marked by elevated operational demand, increased crimes against persons, and higher levels of theft and drug-related activity, while serious violent offences such as robbery, sexual assault, and homicide remained absent.

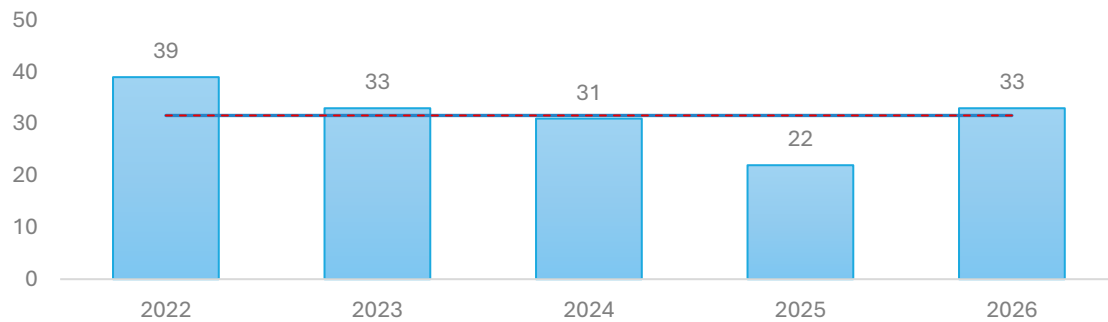

5 Year Average - 13



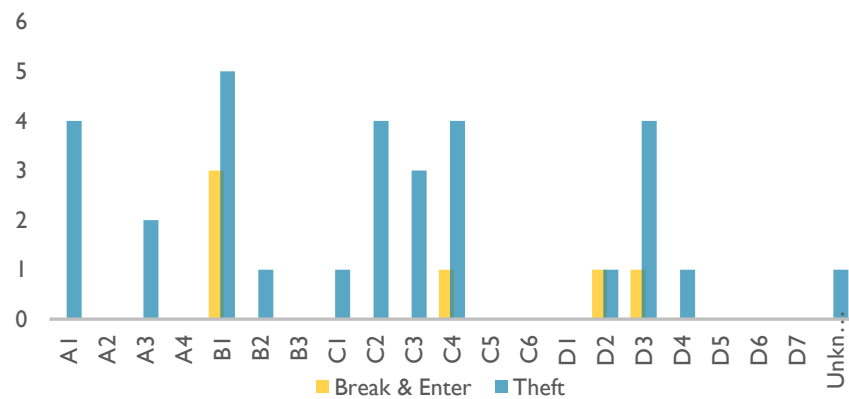

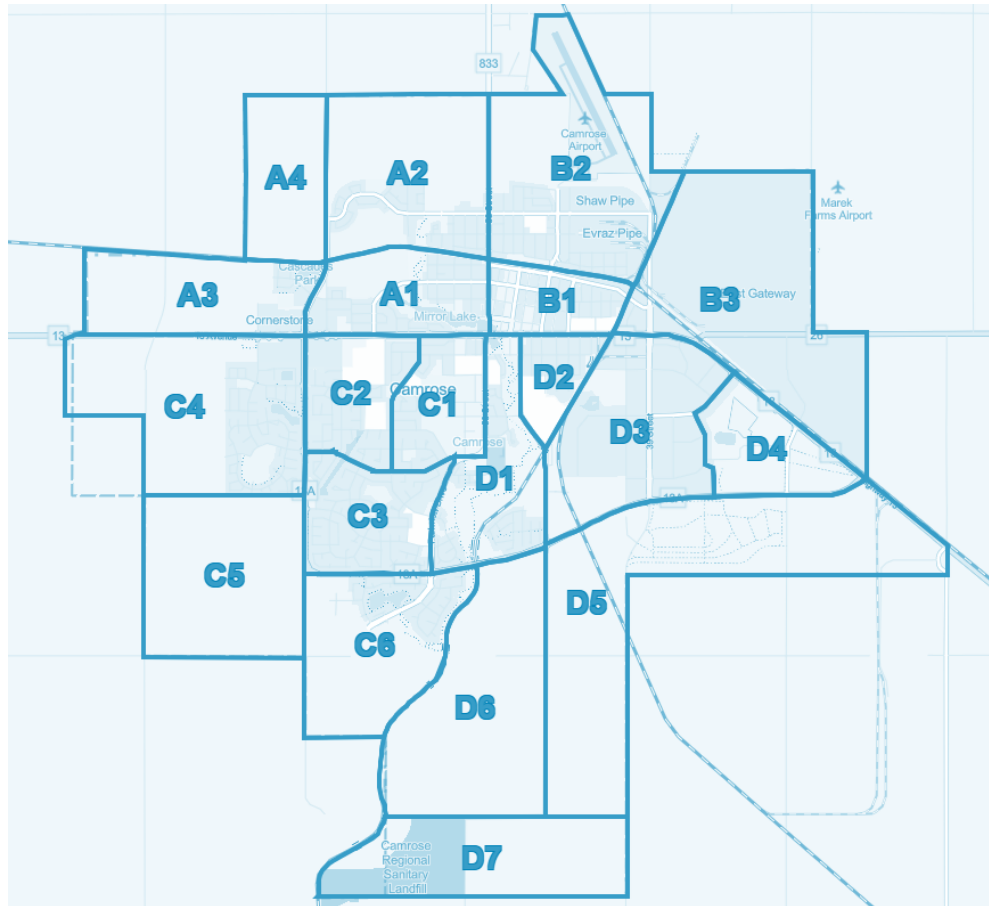
5 Year Average - 32



Break & Enter and Theft

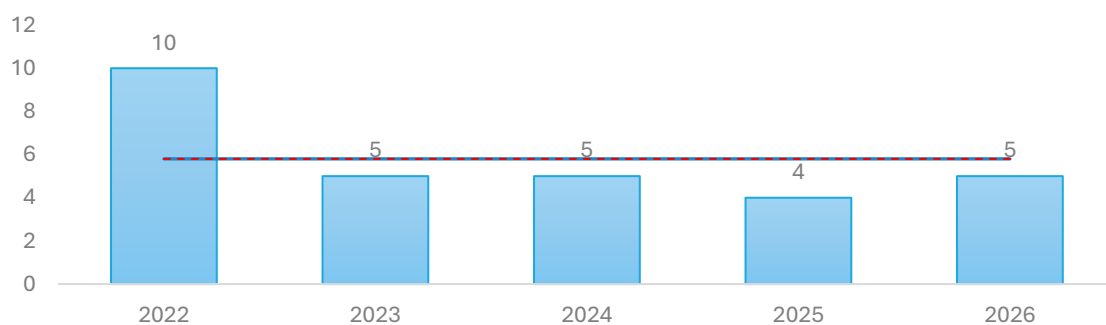
Occurrence Zones





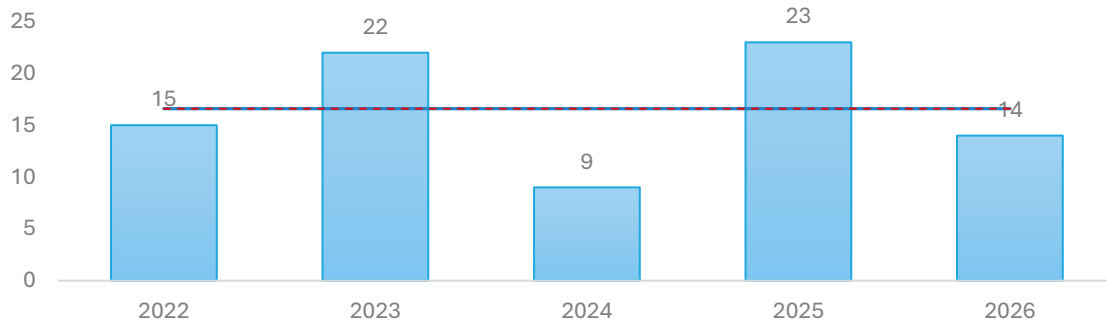
Theft of Motor Vehicle

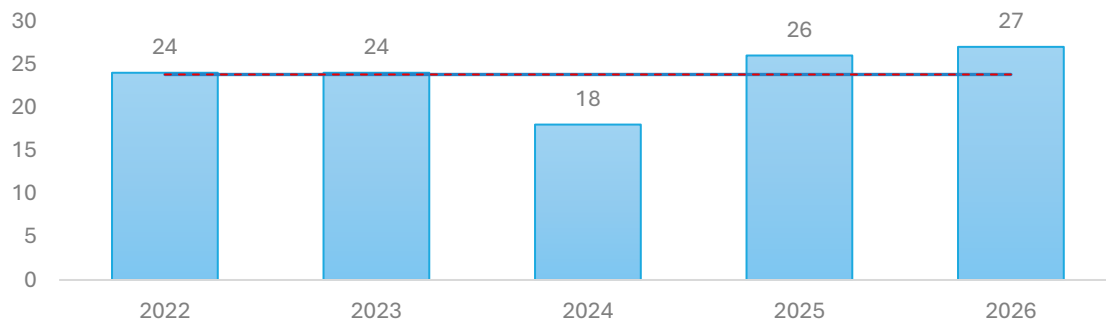

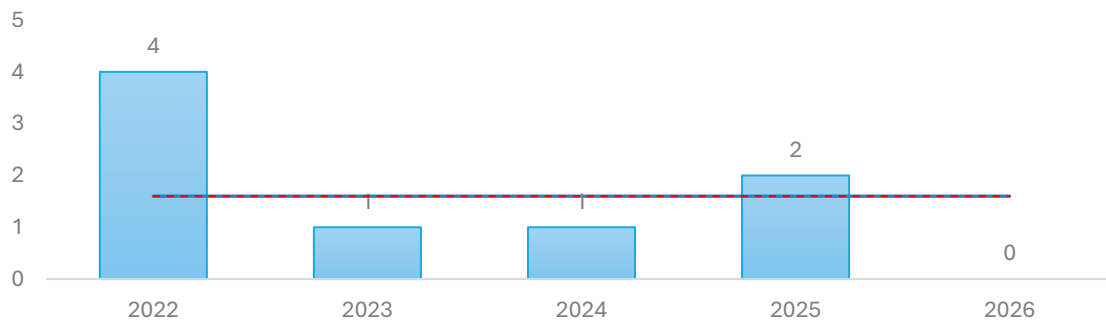

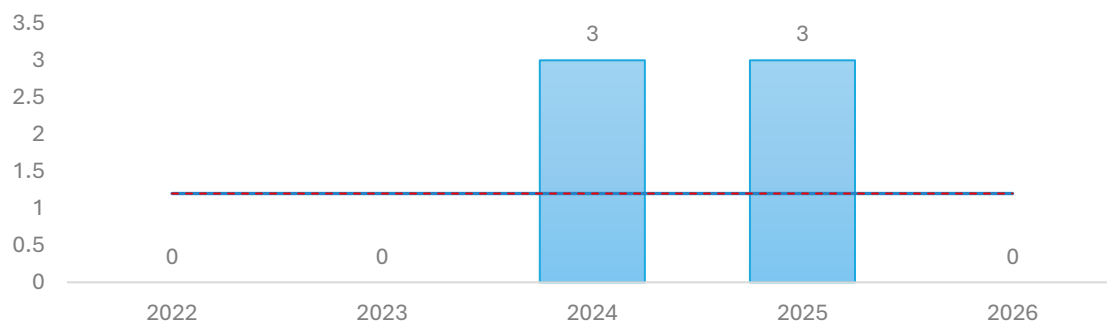
Sexual Assault

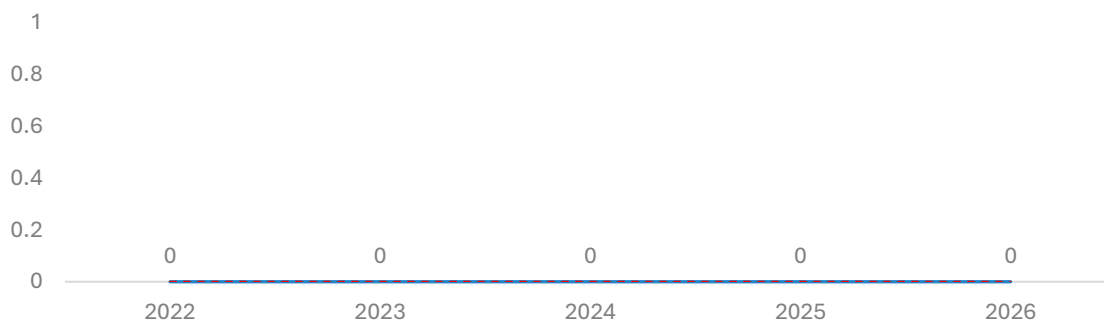

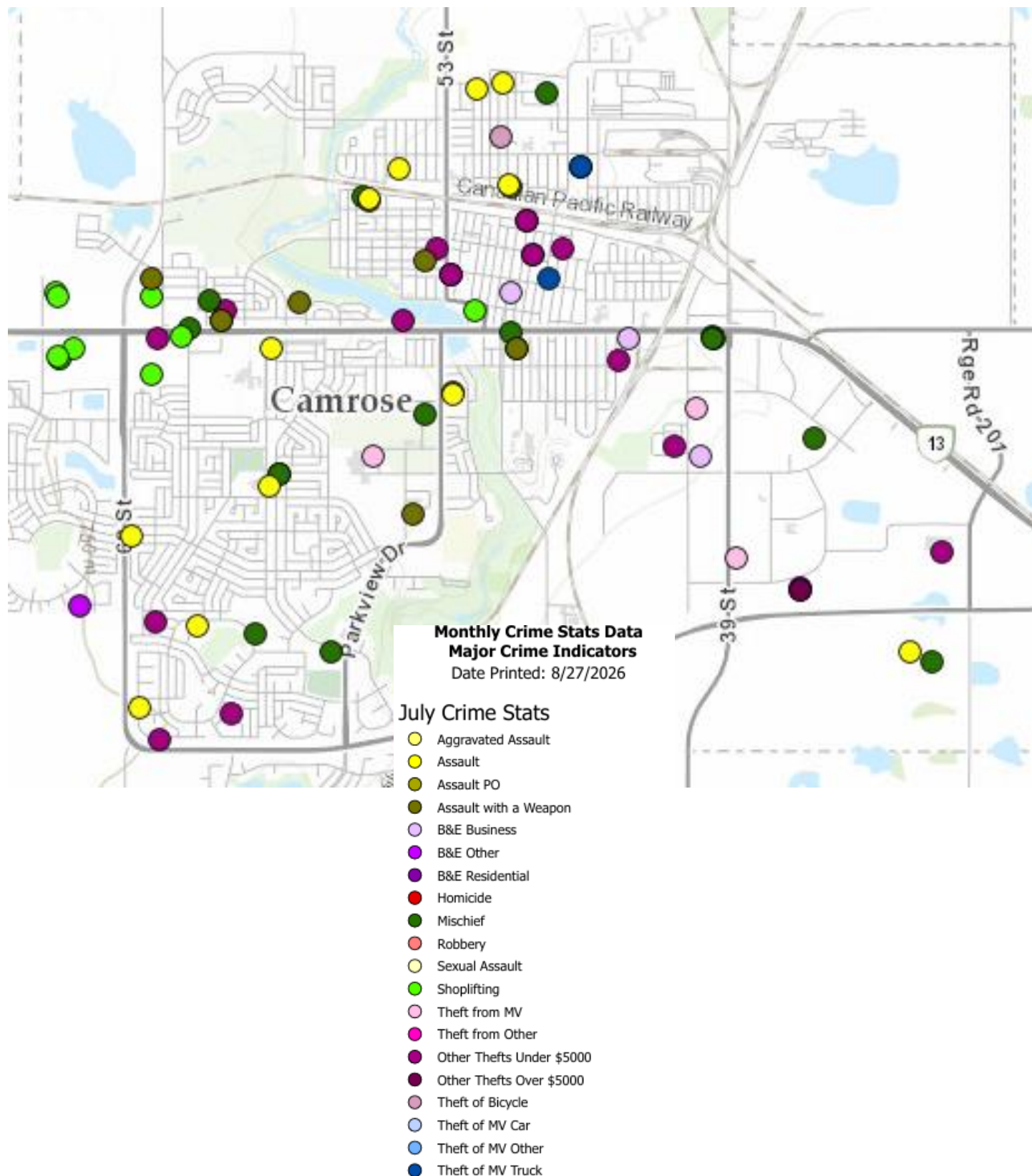

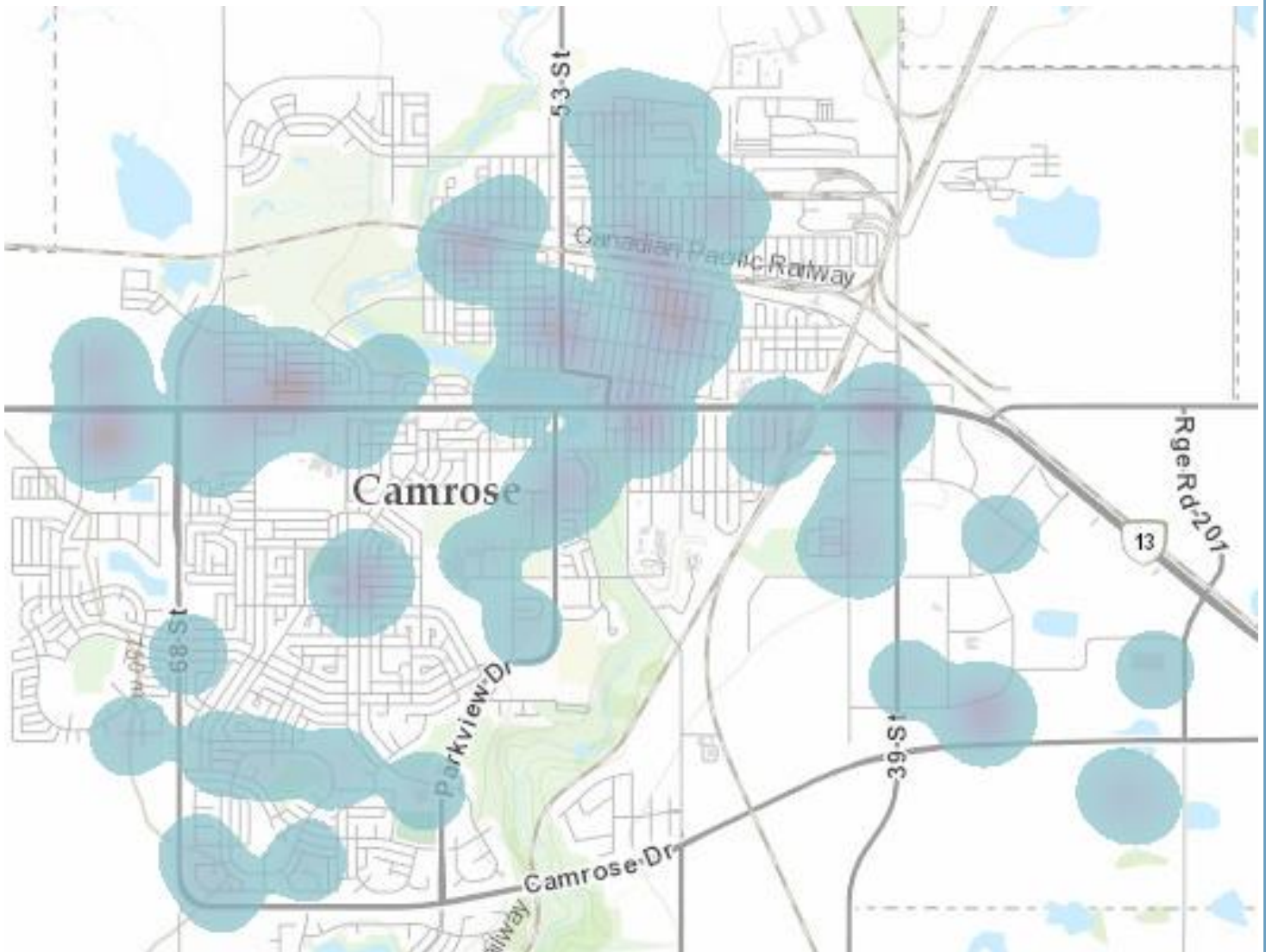

July 2026 Eight Crime Indicators Map



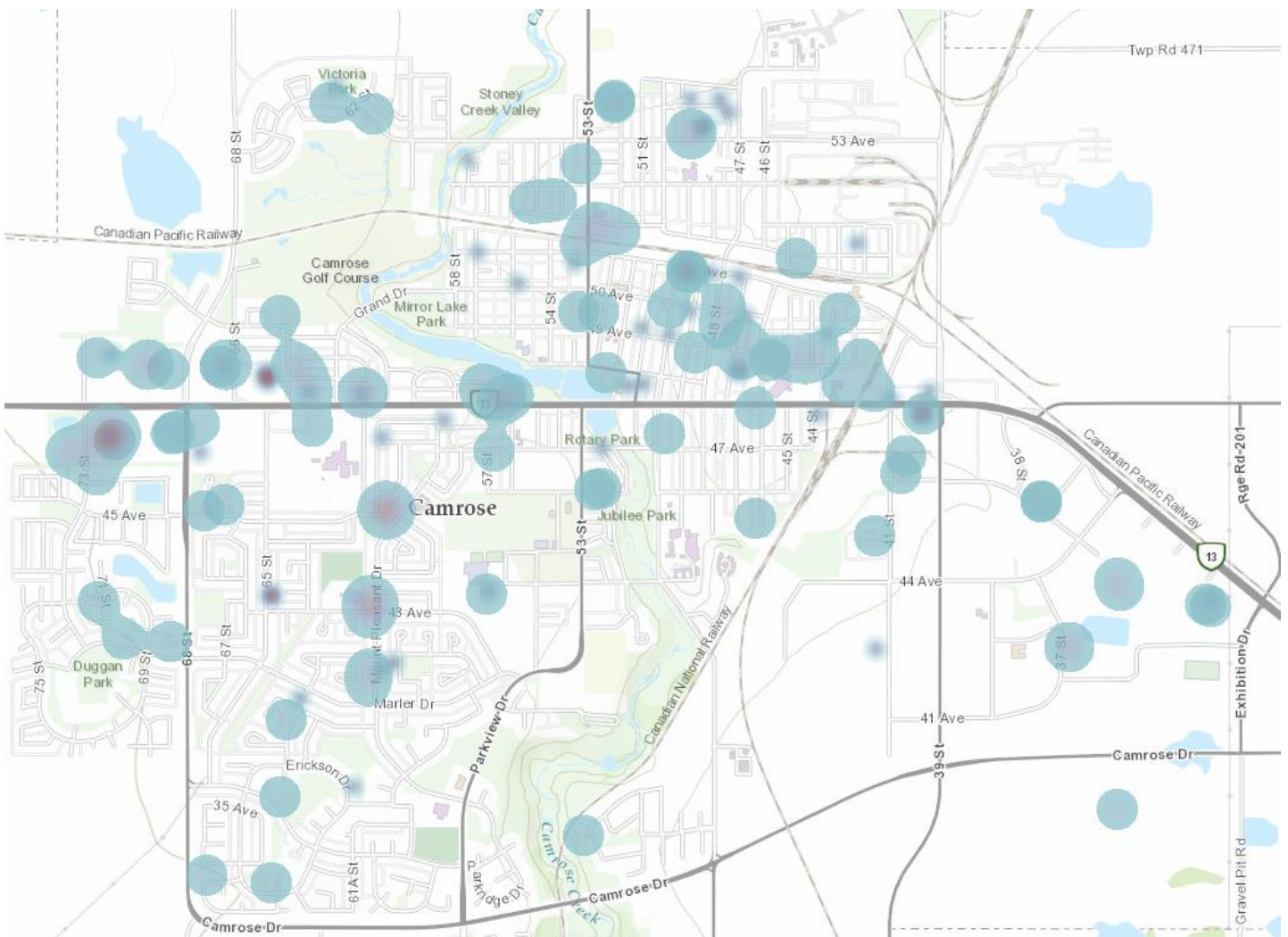
Eight Crime Indicators Heat Map – July 2026



Eight Crime Indicators Heat Map

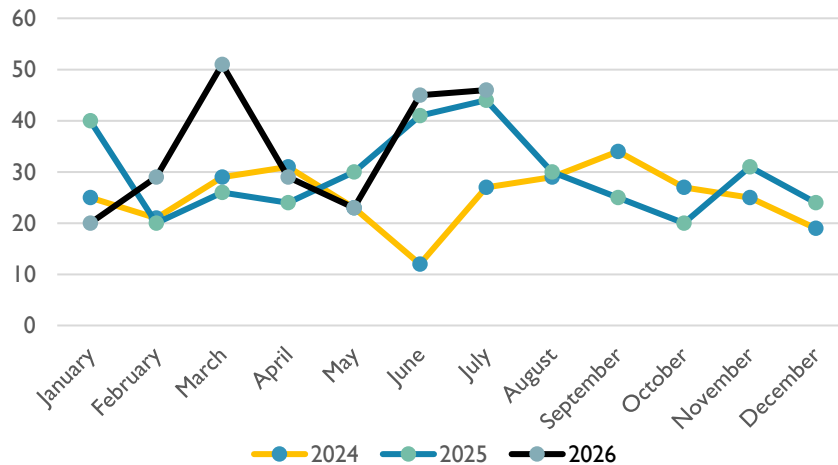

Crimes Against Persons

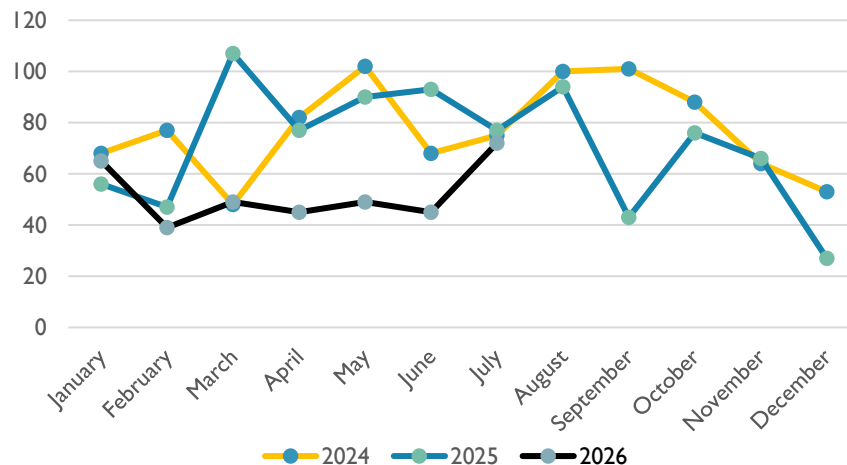
5 Year Monthly Average – 37

Crimes Against Property

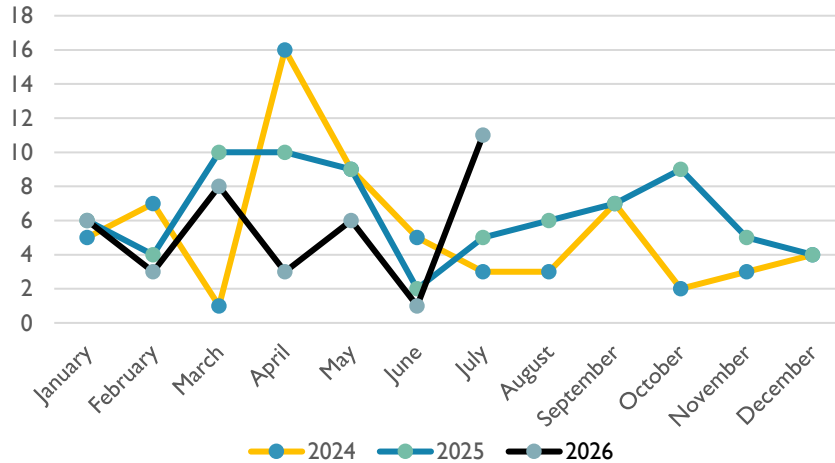
5 Year Monthly Average – 80

5 Year Monthly Average – 5

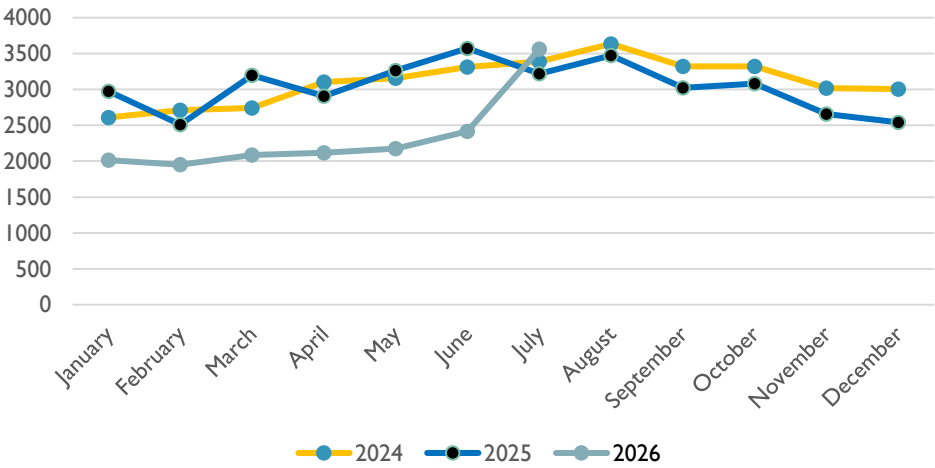


There were 11 drug offence occurrences in July of 2026, compared to 5 occurrences in July of 2025 and 3 occurrences in July of 2024.

Month-to-month fluctuations in drug offence occurrences are often influenced by the length of proactive investigations before they are concluded

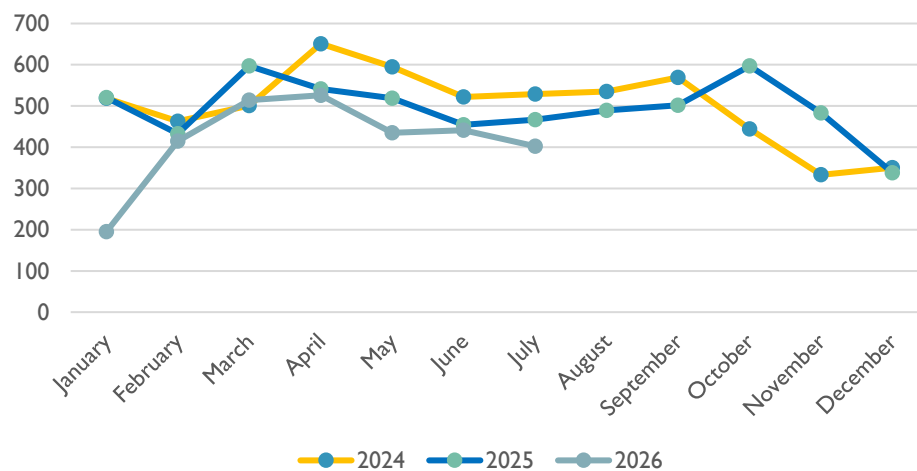

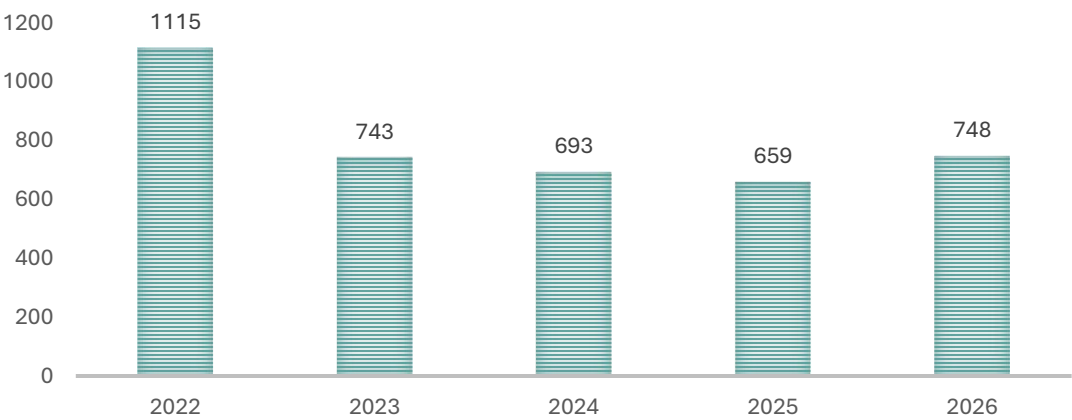

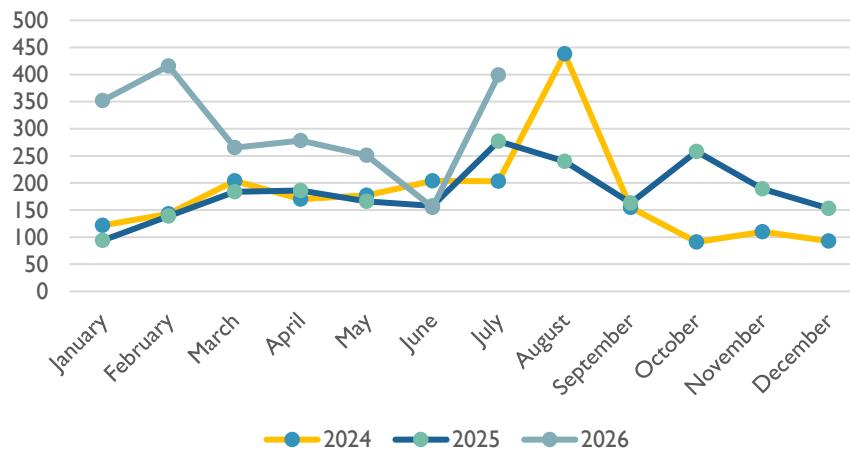

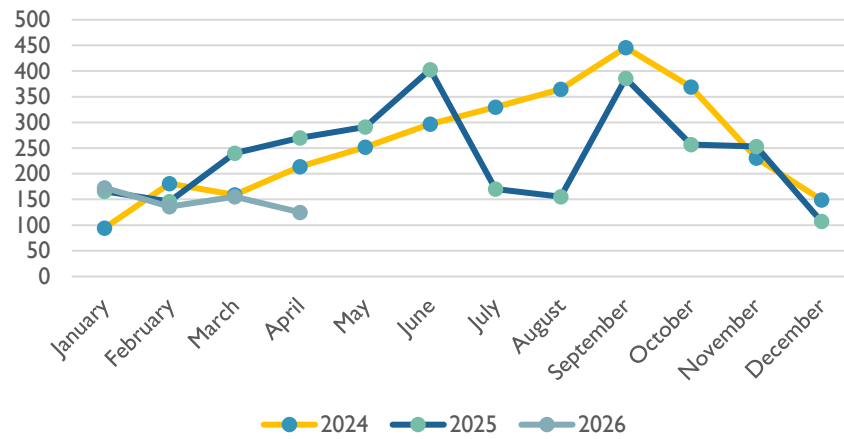

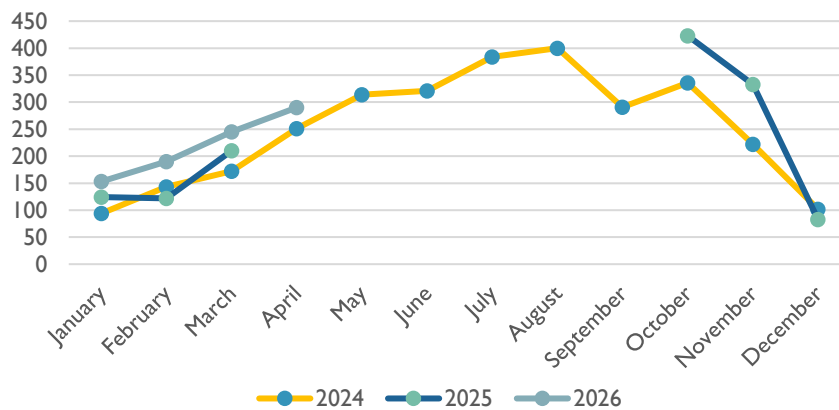

The Intersection Safety Device located at 68 Street & 48 Avenue was effective from February 1, 2020, however was not operational from April 1, 2025 to October 9, 2025. The device was reactivated on October 10, 2025.

“Mandatory Alcohol Screening” (MAS) Statistics

In July 2026, officers conducted **57 Mandatory Alcohol Screening (MAS)** tests, resulting in **10 charges** under the **Immediate Roadside Sanctions (IRS)** program. **No** charges were issued under the **Alberta Zero Alcohol Tolerance (AZAT)** provisions for Graduated Driver Licensing participants, and **no 24-hour suspensions** were recorded. Overall, **18% of all drivers tested** were found to be in contravention of applicable alcohol-related sanctions.

There were no impaired by alcohol or drug occurrences during the month.

Drug Impaired Driving Tests

In the month of July 2026 there were **no Standard Field Sobriety Tests (SFST)** or **Drug Recognition Evaluation Test (DRE)** performed.
