The purpose of this report is to provide a standardized monthly analysis of crime trends within the City of Camrose. The report focuses on the eight primary crime indicators and presents statistical comparisons, trends, and contextual analysis to support operational decision-making, strategic planning, and community awareness.

Data Sources & Methodology:

Data contained in this report is derived from police Records Management Systems (RMS), Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD), and internal statistical tracking. Occurrence counts reflect reported incidents and may be subject to change as investigations continue or late reports are received.

Executive Summary:

January recorded 62 occurrences across the eight crime indicators, consistent with both January 2025 and the five-year average. Although this reflects a month over month increase of 36 occurrences, the rise is largely attributable to December’s anomalously low activity rather than a meaningful shift in underlying crime trends.

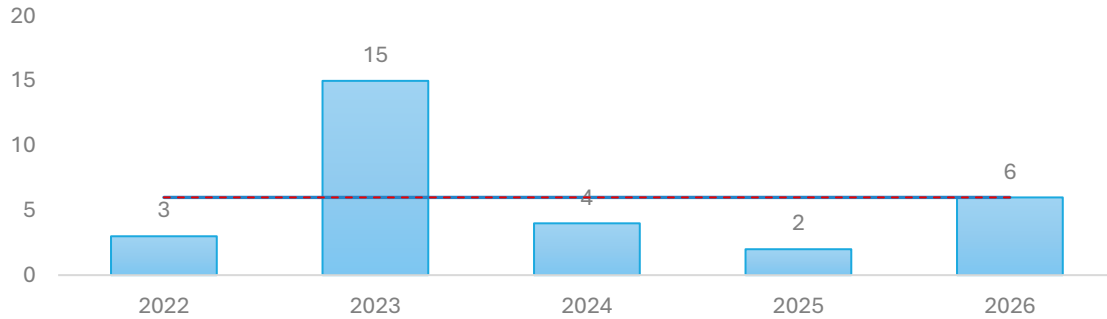
Crimes Against Persons declined by 50% from December and remained 23% below the five-year average. Of the 13 Assault files, eight involved intimate partner violence, and both Sexual Assault reports were historical in nature and remain under investigation.

Crimes Against Property increased by 16% from December and are 7% above the five-year average. Break and Enter occurrences primarily involved business compounds and a construction site entered after hours. Theft files included 13 theft from vehicle incidents and nine shoplifting events. CPS also responded to seven flight from police occurrences involving suspects who fled dangerously to avoid apprehension. The increase in property crime is attributed to a concentrated series of offences believed to be committed by a small group of prolific offenders – predominantly in the west central residential area of the city. Coordinated efforts between CPS and RCMP led to the arrest of a male and female on January 28, which subsequently helped curtail the uptick in crime in the area.

Overall, January reflects a return to typical seasonal crime levels following an unusually low December, with property related offences—particularly theft—driving the month’s increase.

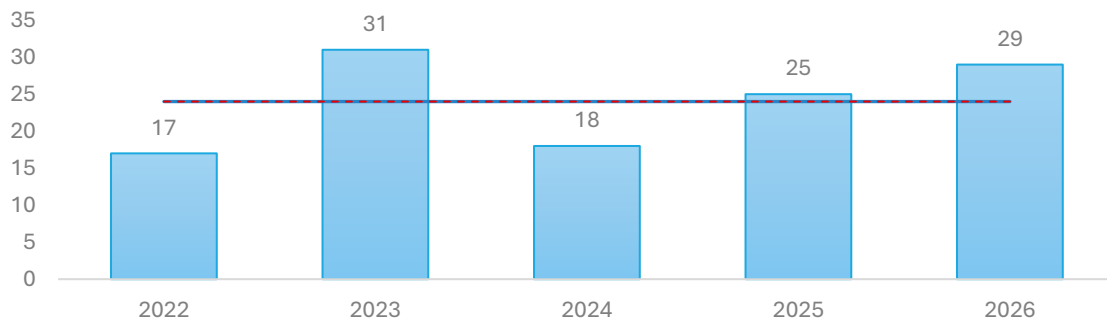

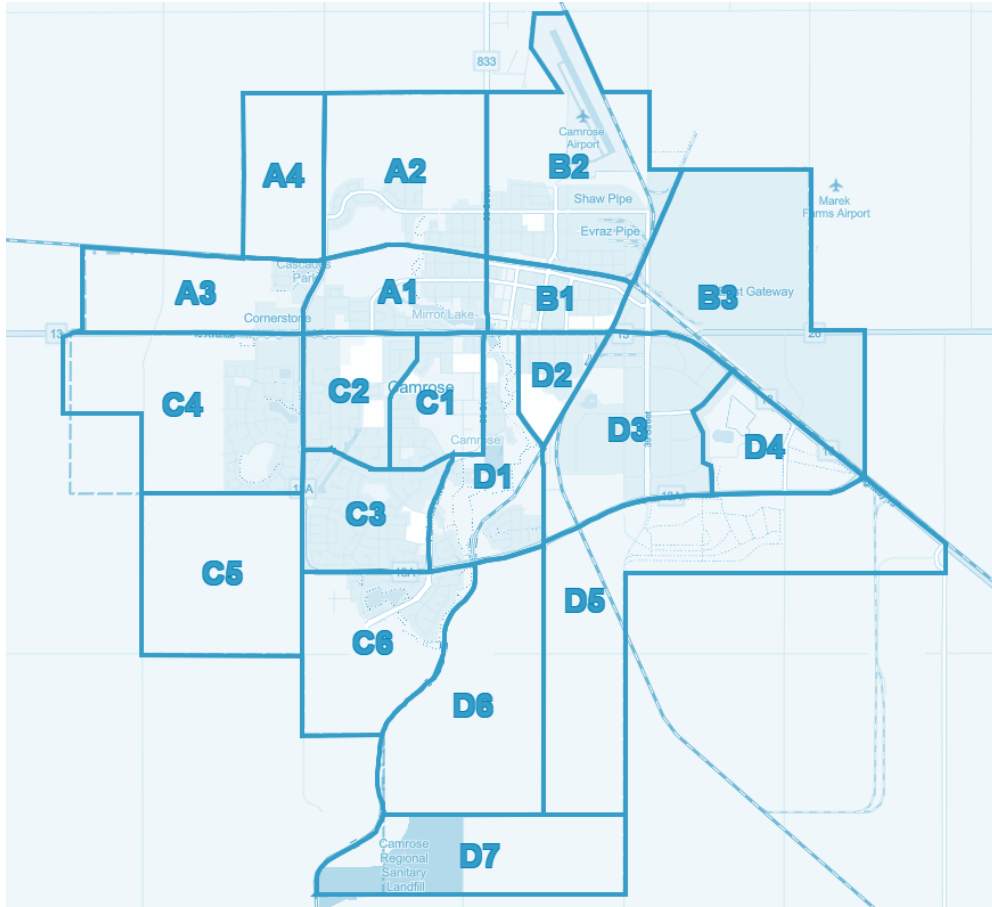
5 Year Average - 24



Break & Enter and Theft

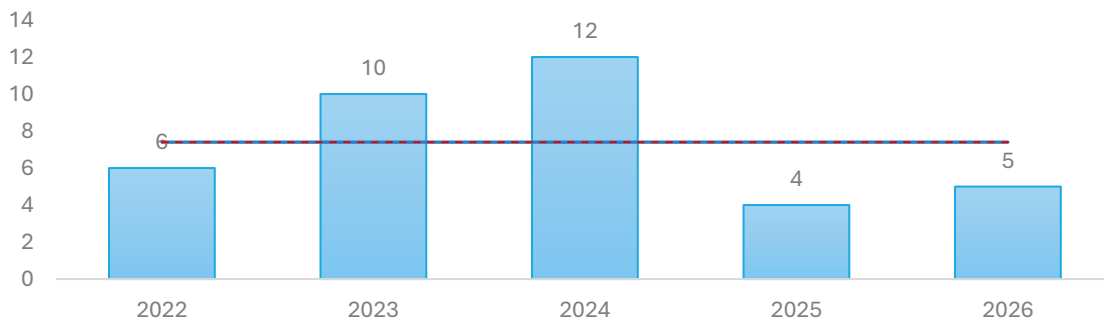
Occurrence Zones

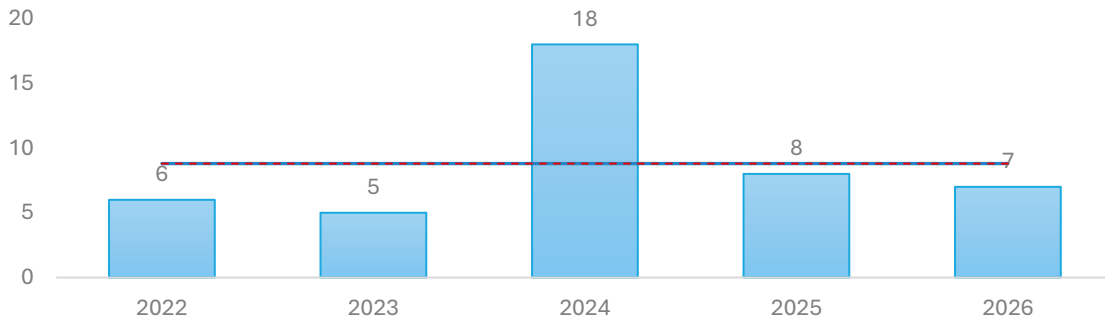

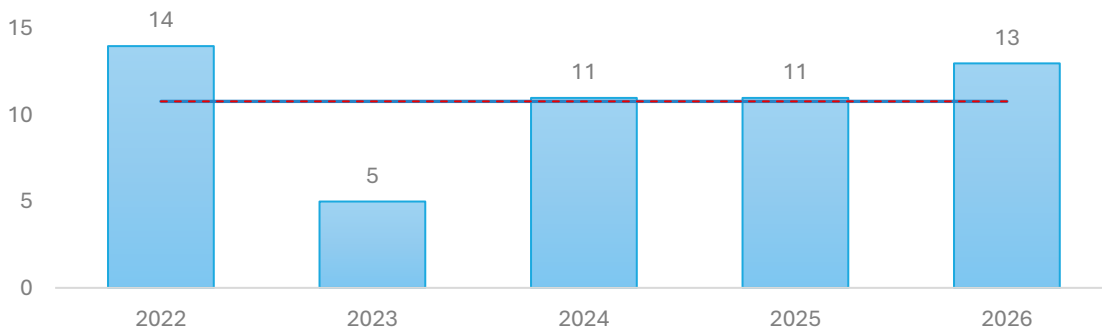

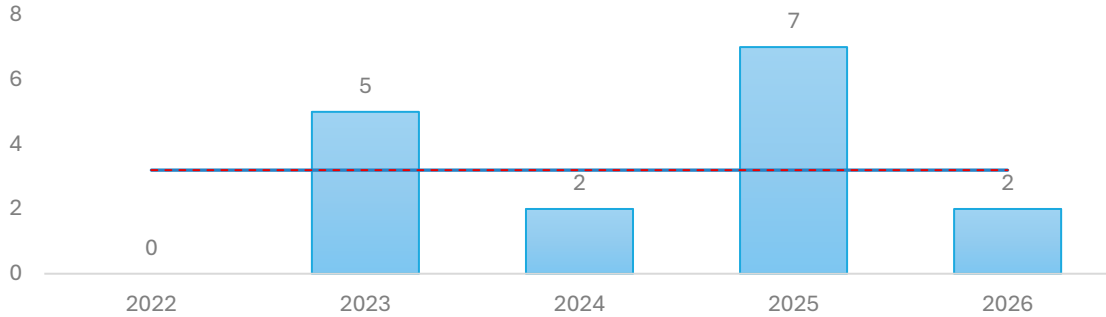

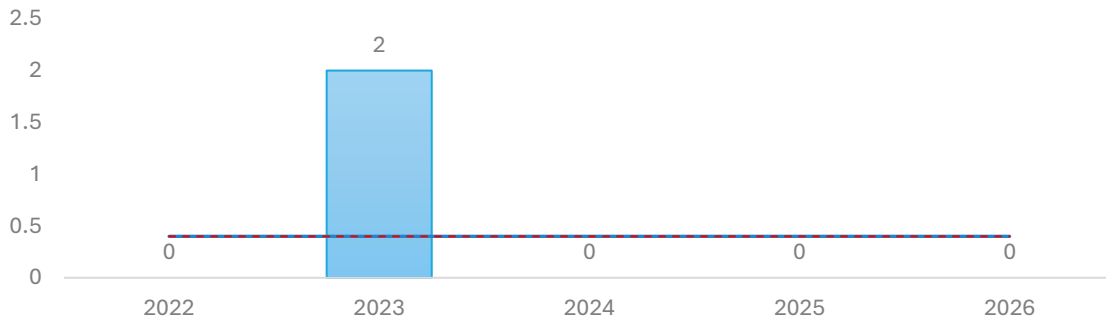

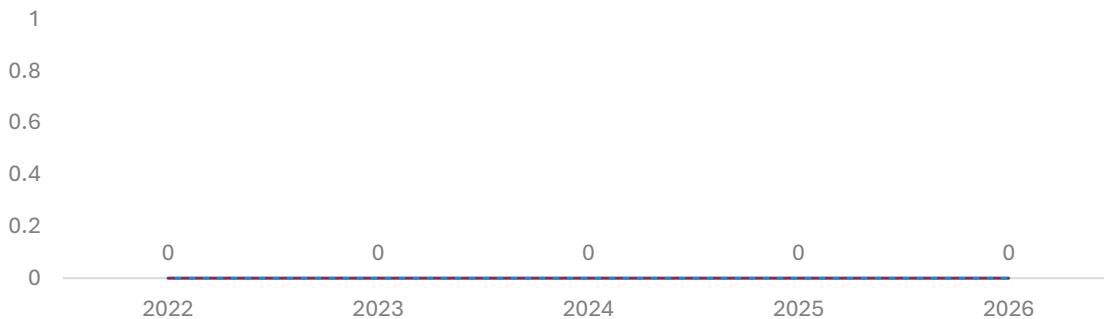

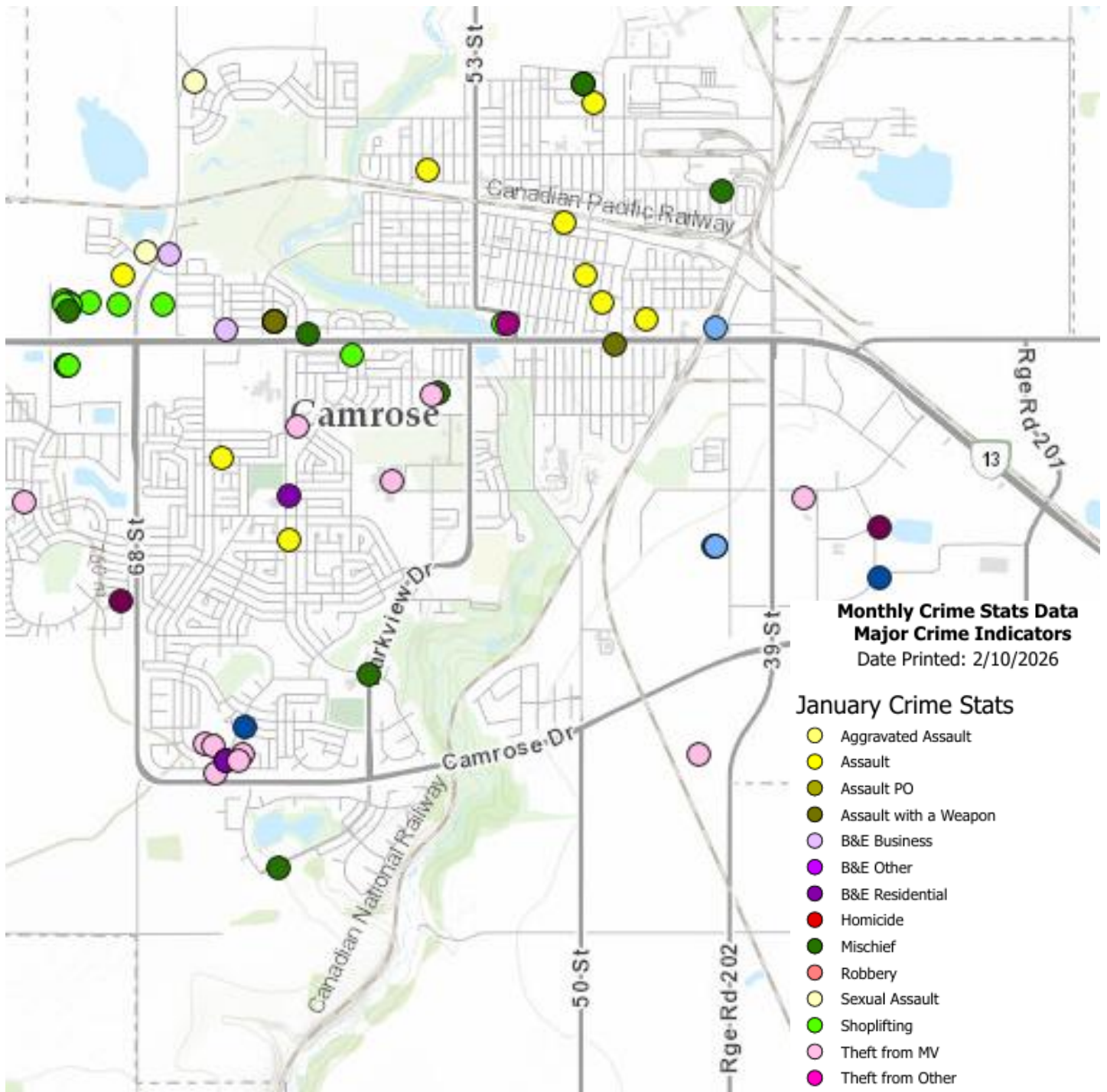

January 2026 Eight Crime Indicators Map

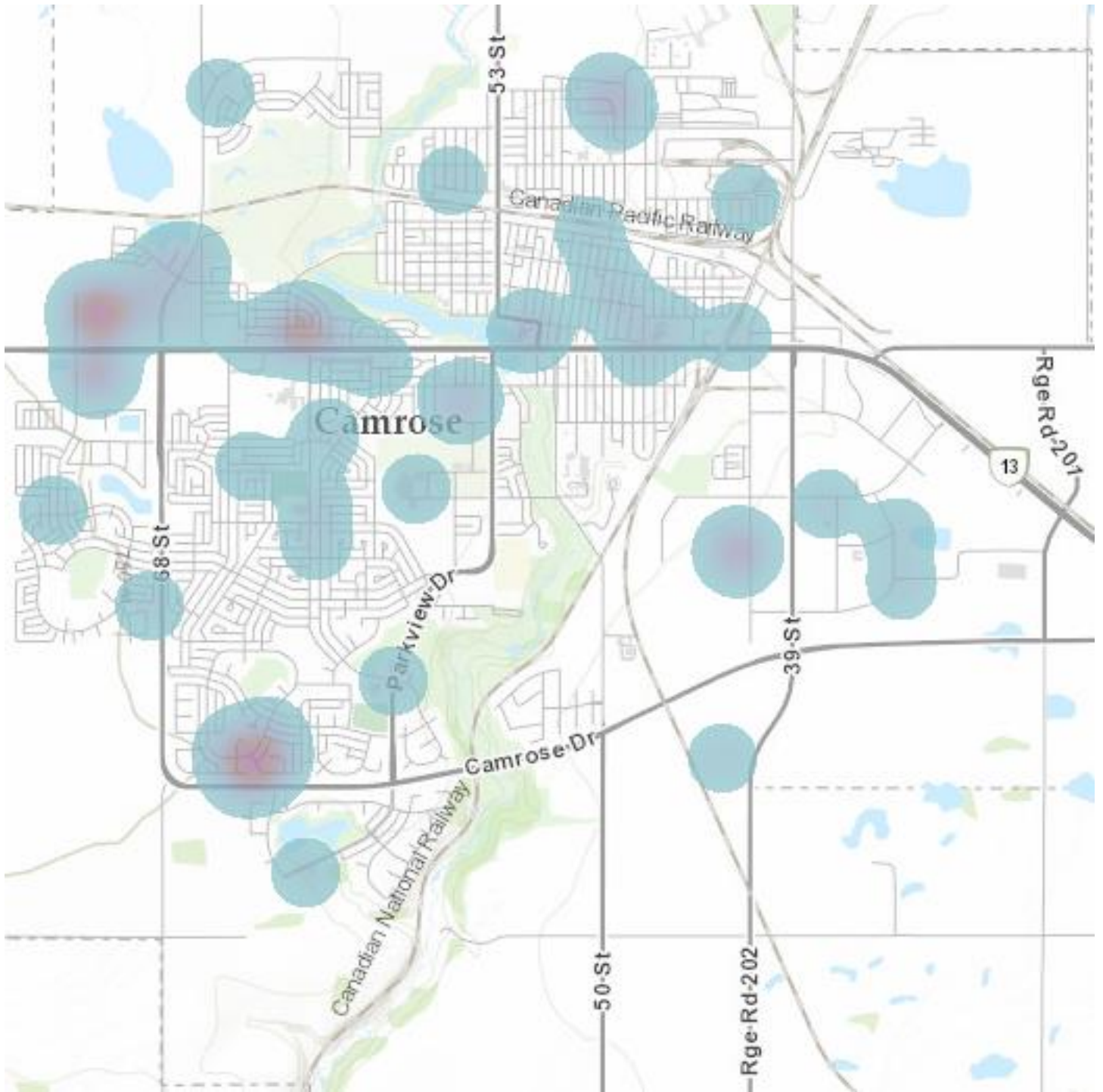

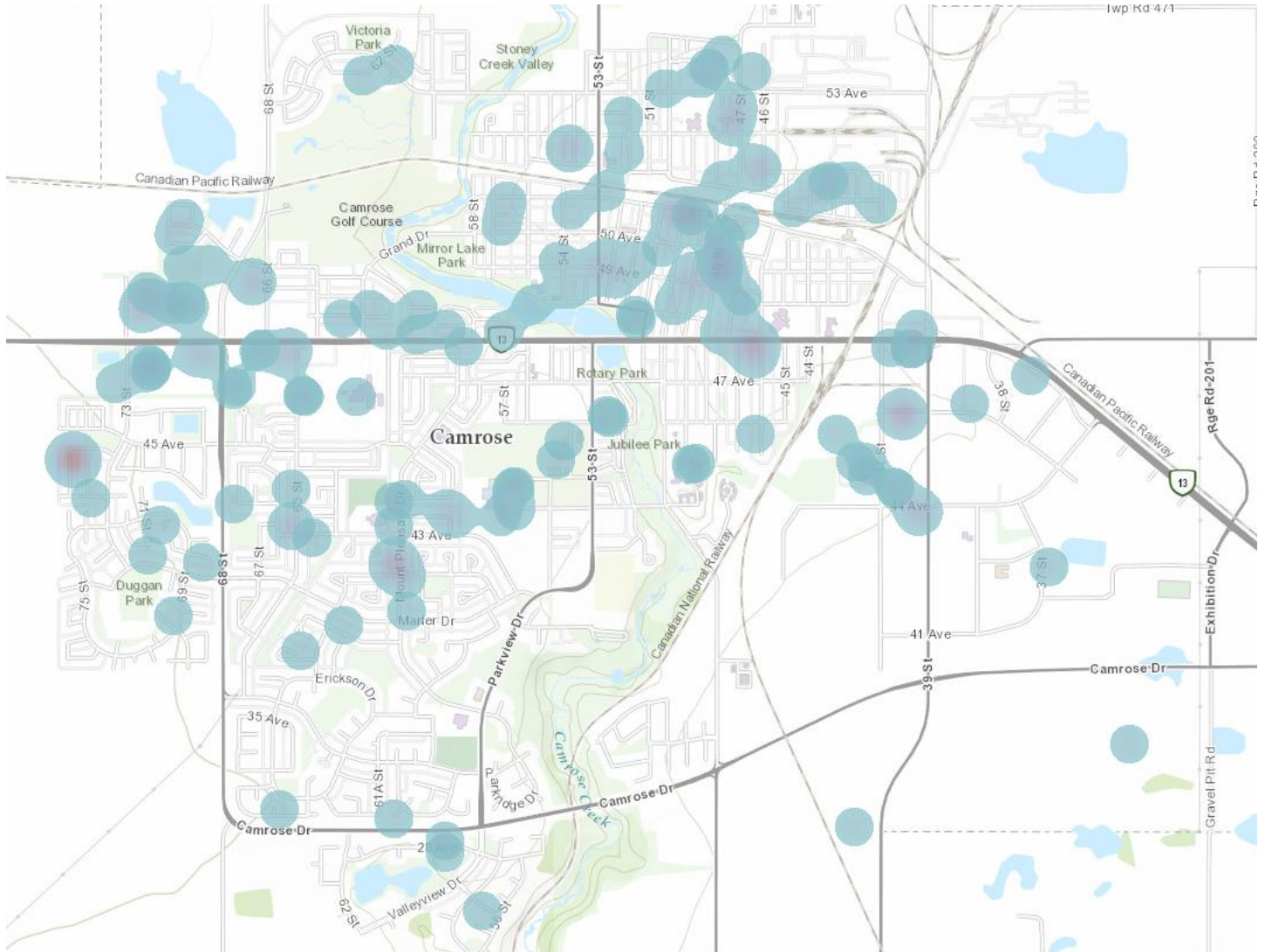

Eight Crime Indicators Heat Map – January 2026

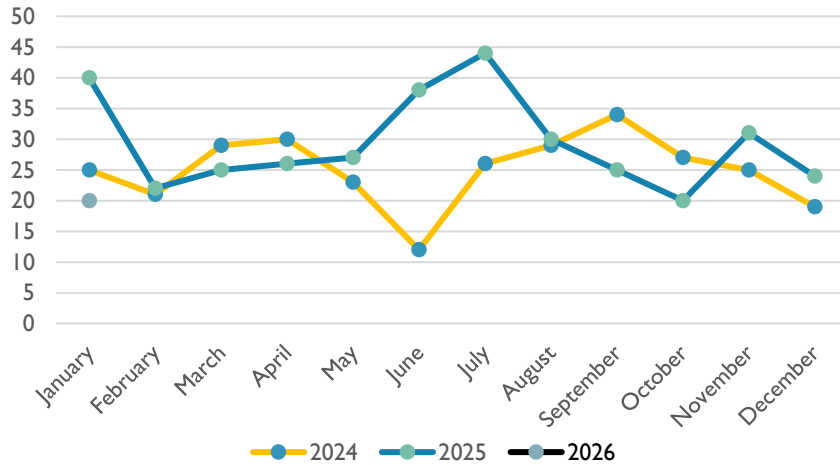


Eight Crime Indicators Heat Map for 4th Quarter October - December, 2025

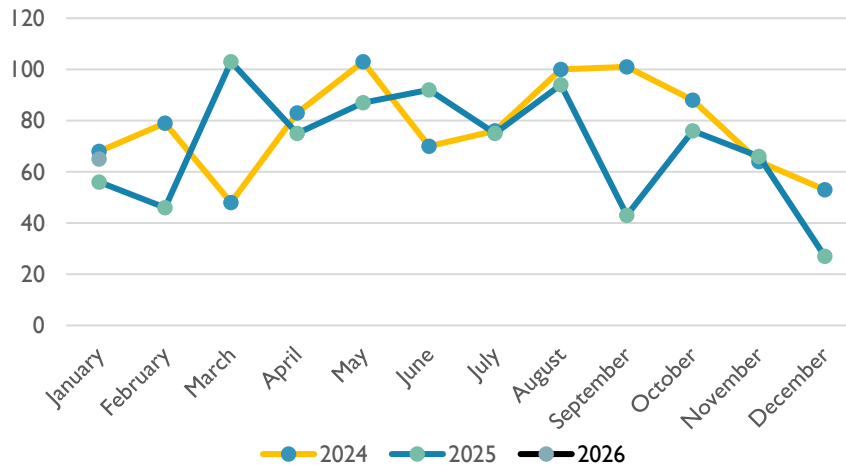
5 Year Monthly Average – 26

Crimes Against Property

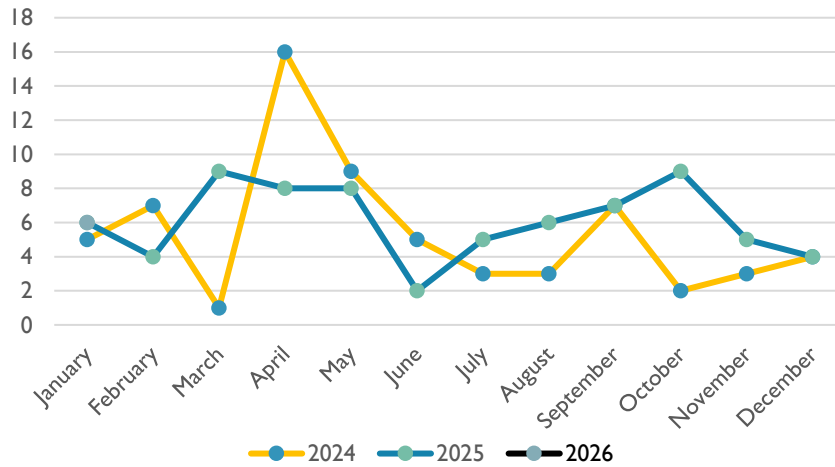
5 Year Monthly Average – 61

Drug Occurrences

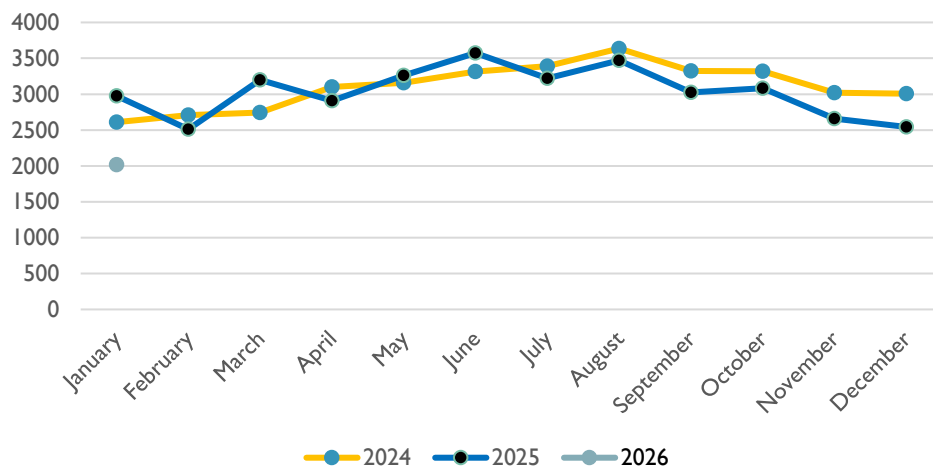
5 Year Monthly Average – 5



There were 6 drug offence occurrences in January of 2026, compared to 6 occurrences in January of 2025, and 5 occurrences in January of 2024.

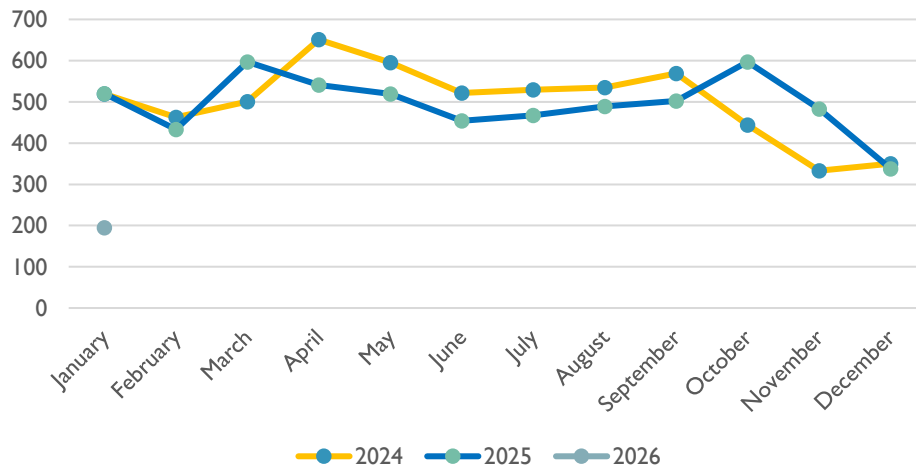

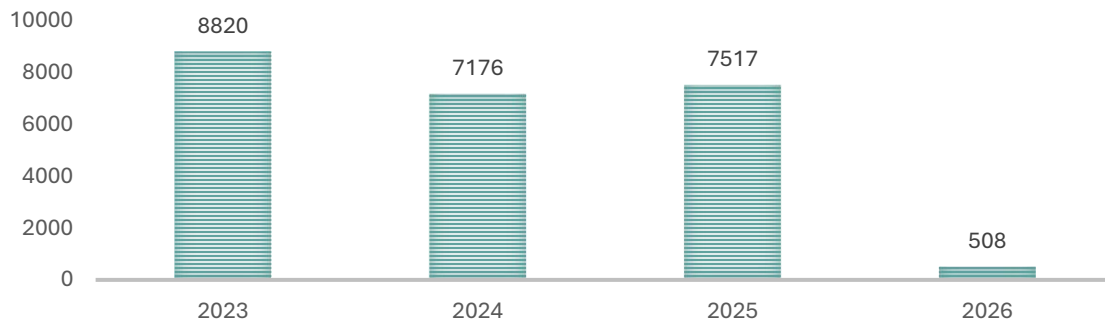

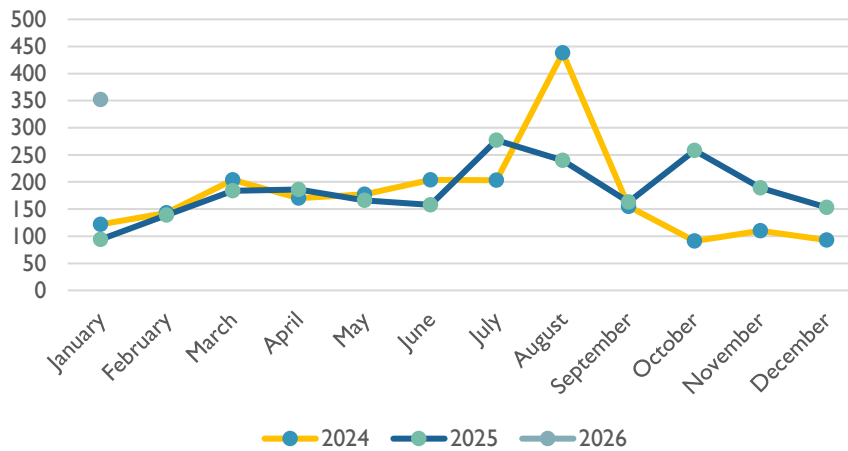

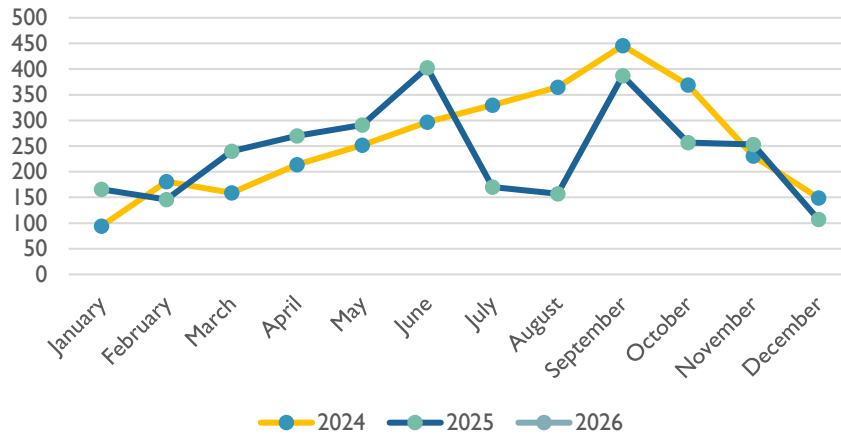

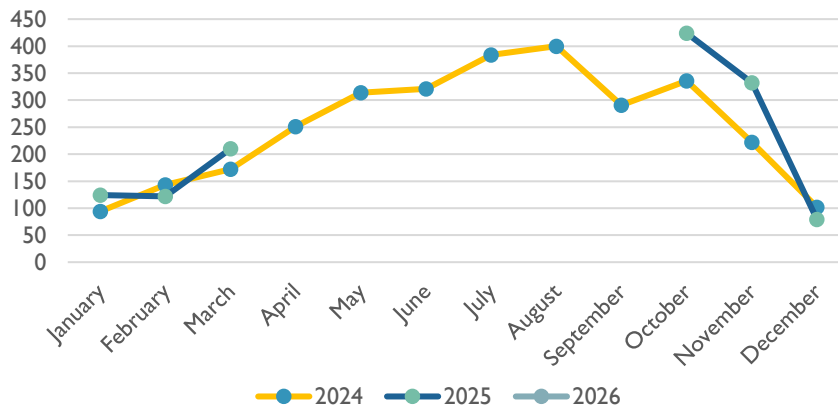

The Intersection Safety Device located at 68 Street & 48 Avenue was effective from February 1, 2020, however was not operational from April 1, 2025 to October 9, 2025. The device was reactivated on October 10, 2025.

“Mandatory Alcohol Screening” (MAS) Statistics

In January 2026, officers conducted **161 Mandatory Alcohol Screening (MAS)** tests, resulting in **seven charges** under the **Immediate Roadside Sanctions (IRS)** program. No charges were issued under the **Alberta Zero Alcohol Tolerance (AZAT)** provisions for Graduated Driver Licensing participants, and **two 24-hour suspensions** were recorded. Overall, **6% of all drivers tested** were found to be in contravention of applicable alcohol-related sanctions.

There were also no impaired by alcohol or drug occurrences during the month.

Drug Impaired Driving Tests

During the month of January 2026 there was **1 Standard Field Sobriety Tests (SFST)** and **1 Drug Recognition Evaluation Test (DRE)** performed.
